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Important changes. New bills before the state legislature HB7133 officially which lowers child blood lead levels from 10 micrograms per decilitre to 5 micrograms per decilitre.

Governor's bill 7193 which that will reduce per capita funding budget health departments receive by 20%.

Another bill is being proposed which allows billing Medic Aid or undocumented children, and adult care. Currently, Stamford Health Dept. Cannot bill for Medic Aid; however, the health dept can bill MediCare but only as a roster biller.

Unclaimed bodies: CT State Medical examiner placed responsibility on municipalities to bury. As per Jerry Bolsiak, there are at least twenty bodies yearly. Thus far, Bolsiak has received five this year alone.
