Letter from Attorney Sarah Fifield – 440-448 Courtland Ave, Blighted Property	Letter is addressed to Anti-Blight Board and Health Commission. Atty. Fifield indicates that she and her husband own a rental condo which overlooks the blighted property (440-448 Courtland Ave). Atty. Fifield presents history of (alleged) owner neglect including: cutting off / removal of building gutters after they were storm damaged; storage of industrial equipment and unregistered / inoperable vehicles in (residentially zoned) parking lot; failure to mow lawn permitting growth to hip height; permitting residents to use fenced in area at front of building as a dump. She continues with information regarding 2013 lack of action on the owner's part. She alleges that around March 2013 at least one unit of the property was occupied by "squatters" and that a severe fire resulted when a fire was lit in the unit due to the lack of electricity. As a result of the fire, the property appears blackened and damaged and continues to be so. Included with the letter are several photos showing some of the damage described in the letter and the temporary repairs to the building that have been made to that damage. Atty. Fifield complains that for 8 months the owner has taken no action to repair the fire damage and that this has had a severe negative effect on neighboring
