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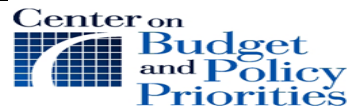

**FY 2013 Budget Update**

- Starting FY 13 – flat budget
- Additional 5% budget reduction due to sequester for 5 years

**Stamford WIC Initiatives**

- Breastfeeding Promotion and Support
- Continued Collaboration with Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Education (SNAP)
- Continued participation in Stamford Childhood Obesity Taskforce

**Breastfeeding Promotion and Support**

- Women receive breastfeeding encouragement, support, and education.
- WIC promotes breastfeeding as the first choice for infant feeding.
- Stamford WIC currently has 5 Certified Lactation Counselors on staff.

**Provide Breastfeeding Incentives and Support**

- Fully breastfeeding mothers receive most variety and largest quantity of food.
- Fully breastfeeding infants > 6 months receive larger quantities of baby food fruits and vegetables; also baby food meat.

**Childhood Obesity Prevention**

Weight Gain Grid Revised  
Pre-pregnant BMI 25 overweight: *15-25 lb wt gain recommended -single gestation (IOM 2009)*
  - **Birth – Age 2:** WHO Growth Charts Length/Age:  
Weight/Age, Weight/Length
  - **Age 2 - 5:** CDC Growth Charts Stature /Age;  
Weight/Age; Weight/Stature, BMI/Age
  - **Family Nutrition Education: 5-2-1-0 (5)**  
Fruit/Vegetable, 2 hours or less screen time, 1 hour or more physical activity, 0 to almost no sugar-sweetened beverages

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<p>Ted Jankowski, Director of Public Safety, Health &amp; Welfare</p>	<p>Mr. Jankowski updated the Commission of the following items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Budgets: The Health &amp; Social Services budgets were not cut by the boards proposed budget as per Mayor Pavia.</li> <li>• Well testing: The Well testing will continue, it is changing from the volatile organic compounds and will be testing for Arsenic and Uranium</li> <li>• Family Day Event: Saturday, May 18, at the Boys and Girls Club.</li> <li>• Mr. Jankowski informed the HC that a schools safety assessment will be completed within the next two weeks, and sent to all applicable boards.</li> </ul>	<p>Ms. Scott will forward Family Day flyers to the commissioners.</p>

**Old Business:**

<p>Walkability Accessibility</p>	<p>Dr. Decker updated the commission on efforts to improve the walkability &amp; accessibility in Stamford. She is in contact with the neighborhood associations, in particular the Eastside Partnership which is proactive and trying to get sidewalks repaired. East Main Street has been identified as the most dangerous road for pedestrian crossing according to _____. Dr. Decker has put them in touch with the United Way of Western CT for possible grant funding to make some improvements.</p>	
<p>Dangerous Intersections</p>	<p>Dr. Corvo is continuing his quest to identify dangerous intersections in Stamford. He is seeking information/data on traffic accidents, fatality or trauma incidents in Stamford. He is currently trying to work off the Ambulance call sheets, and could use help with getting the data. They are ultimately looking at what intersections are dangerous; not just with people that have accidents or traumas, but maybe the near misses would help. Ms. Parry suggested that Dr. Corvo might be able to use statistical algorithms to project areas that are most dangerous</p>	

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	with minimal data . Director Jankowski asked about the possibility of establishing a website allowing people to do self- reporting.	
Stamford Symposium on Childhood Obesity (April 25, 2013)	Dr. Decker reported the symposium was attended with interesting speakers; such as a CDC representative that spoke on Childhood Obesity. Ms. Parry also commented on the speakers, especially the speaker from New Haven, who described community efforts including a random household survey that was done and their decision to concentrate on three areas only; unhealthy diet, exercise and smoking.	
Carry the Load	Ms. Parry mentioned Carry the Load at last month meeting, today she distributed handouts to the Health Commissioners. Ms. Parry described Carry the Load as a national movement to honor and remember those who have served: Military, Police and Fire, along with their families on Memorial Day. Ms. Parry is working on increasing awareness of what Carry the Load means and will participate in the 2013 Memorial Day Parade. She is in the process of planning an event for 2014.	Ms. Parry will take names of anyone that is interested in walking in the parade.

**New Business:**

Mill River Collaborative Event	Dr. Ballin reported the Mill River Collaborative Event was a great demonstration of something that will be helpful to Stamford with bicycle and walking path. Over 600 people attended the event.
