Guards at Schools	Dr. Decker asked the commissioners their opinions	

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	about the article in <i>Stamford Advocate</i> regarding guards at schools. A brief discussion followed; many offered their personal opinions.	
Crossing Guards	Ms. Parry noted; Mr. Jankowski said he would follow up on the HC question regarding what school crossing guards are told, and what they are supposed to do. Mr. Jankowski would find out what Crossing Guards are told or if there are instructions.	
Walkability	Dr. Decker stated that the walking discussions are moving along. She will be attending the Westside Revitalization Committee meeting on Tuesday, where she will participate in a discussion about walking. Dr. Decker informed the HC of an upcoming conference in April on the prevention of childhood obesity. She will keep the HC posted on the date. There was a discussion about who in the COS that is working on the walkability. Dr. Decker responded that there are several city agencies and community groups; such as the Planning and the Planning & Zoning Board, as well as several studies of roads in Stamford with an eye to walkability and safe pedestrian and automobile traffic.
