The paperwork has not been completed but the candidate hired is an internal employee. This person will also serve as Assistant DOH.</li><li>• Two Inspector I positions have been posted on the City's website. There department has had many complaints and the department is understaffed but work continues.</li><li>• Lead testing on all school fountains has been conducted. No lead was found.</li><li>• ViewPoint Cloud for environmental inspections continues to be challenging to use. A new program is expected next year.</li><li>• 301 Flu vaccines have been administered.</li><li>• All services provided at Henry Street Clinic are up and running. 476 visits since July.</li><li>• COVID-19 vaccinations are now available for children 5 - 11 years of age.</li><li>• Discussions with Board of Education regarding Health Commission recommendation in June 2020 regarding annual attestations for religious exemptions for vaccinations have not taken place as of yet.</li><li>• Brittany Dube, the Emergency Preparedness Coordinator is working with Red Cross. - Meeting to take place between Director of Health and Board of Education (BOE) regarding Stay and Screen program where students are allowed to continue attending school without quarantining after COVID exposure.
- Contact Tracing System has been nationally recognized. Stamford has a 96% contact rating and a 69% reached & assessed rating.
- COVID vaccination rates for eligible individuals is at 90%. 83% of City employees have been fully vaccinated. Police Department vaccination rate is low at about 60% and Fire Department at about 83%.
- Police Department is opening a Police Activities League at Chester Addison. Various after school athletic and non-athletic programs offered to children. Pursuing grant funding through Board of Finance.
- Police Department - Police exam held in September. Of the 550 applicants only 380 showed up. Down significantly from usual 700 - 800 applicants in prior years.
- As of January 2020, Police Department founded a Mental Health Collaborative with representatives from various state and community organizations. Mr. Jankowski

- Police currently being ordered to work. Department budgeted for 287 positions; current positions filled 270; active positions 255.

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| <p><b>Old Business</b><br/>Influenza Vaccines &amp; Payment</p> <p><b>New Business</b><br/>Facilitation of information between the Health Department and Health Commission</p> | <p>extended an invitation to Health Commissioners for the upcoming meeting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 911 dispatchers have series of questions to determine if nature of call may be mental health. Ms. Parry asked if questions could be shared with Commissioners</li> <li>• Providing Police Department with crisis intervention training. To date, 70% have completed such training.</li> <li>• Partnered with Recovery Network of Programs to provide a Social Worker who's embedded with Police Department to answer mental health crisis related calls made to Dispatch Center. Social worker has answered 200 calls, and followed up within a 24-hr. period with individual to ensure care is being administered.</li> <li>• Reached out to DOMUS CEO to implement similar program as Recovery Network of Programs. Should be available in the next 2 months.</li> <li>• Flu vaccines cost to public is \$25.00.</li> <li>• Commissioners requested being notified of personnel changes, especially key personnel, within Health Department and having input in the selection / interview process for Health Director Position.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr. Jankowski agreed to share questions asked by 911 dispatchers.</li> </ul> |
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
