#### PROPOSAL RESPONSE

#### PROJECT SCOPE

Hole in One Cart Rental Inc. is owned and operated solely by Angela Aulenti a PGA and LPGA professional. Angela has been in the golf business since 1978 and currently the concessionaire at E. Gaynor Brennan golf course for the past 20 years and also the Head Golf Professional at Sterling Farms also in Stamford, CT. for the past 24 years.

Hole in One Cart Rental Inc. will provide complete operations of golf shop, management for the golfer check in and supply, and for rental, to golfer's, golf carts –both motorized and hand pulled.

This service will be provided from January 1 through December 31, from official sunrise to official sunset each day that the course is open for a five year period commencing on January 1, 2019-December 31, 2023.

#### **STAFF**

Hole in One Cart Rental Inc. shall employee one Head Golf Professional, at least one Assistant Golf Professional and such other personnel as shall be reasonably required to effectively perform the duties and responsibilities as agreed upon. An Assistant Golf Professional shall be defined as "a qualified Golf professional or one who has filed notice to become a professional golfer that is pursuing a career to become a professional golfer according to standards and requirements establish by the PGA or LPGA.

### DAILY FINANCIAL OPERATIONS FOR GREEN FEE, PERMITS, LOCKER RENTAL

Hole in One Cart Rental will be responsible for the daily fee cashiering operation including staffing, training, management oversight and reporting on all daily transactions including but not limited to:

- a. Ensuring procedures are in place in order to endure that all appropriate fees are processed, charge and collected. Process all golf cart rental agreements in accordance with Commission guidelines and the collection of rental fees.
- b. Collecting proceeds and accounting for all green's fees.
- c. Collecting and accounting for all other monies due the City for activities relating to daily golf play, including Stamford resident and nonresident ID card processing, gift cards and locker rentals.
- d. Daily reconciliation of all financial transactions.
- e. Depositing daily, all fees collected pursuant to the written instructions of the City of Stamford and the Golf Commission.
- f. Operating and maintaining the golf reservation system under the rules established by the golf commission.

#### **GOLF CARTS**

- a. Hole in One Golf Cart Rental, Inc. shall furnish 68 golf carts necessary for the operation of the golf course and shall assume the total expense of all rental carts;
- b. Hole in One Golf Cart Rental, Inc. and its staff are to insure that golf cart users are advised of the regulations of operation of said carts, and shall take action to correct any known violations of said regulations brought to its attention;
- c. Hole in One Golf Cart Rental, Inc. or its staff ensure carts, (whether gas or electric), are always ready for play, including all daily maintenance per manufacturer's specifications, tires properly inflated, carts

- cleaned and washed as needed or at least weekly, inspected before and after each rental for damage and rotated properly to insure even wear across the fleet. Needed maintenance is to be scheduled in a timely manner with supplier and all other tasks necessary to keep carts in a safe operating condition; and
- d. Hole in One Golf Car Rental, Inc. shall ensure cart rentals are available from the start of daily play until the time established by the Golf Commission for the last cart rental of the day and Hole in One Golf Cart Rental, Inc. will secure all carts and the clubhouse at the end of the day's operation per procedures set forth by the golf commission.

#### PLAY CONTROL

- a. Starters and Rangers are paid by the City, per schedule for hourly rates and maximum hours as set forth in the annual budget for the golf course. Hole in One Cart Rental shall hire, schedule and provide training and supervision for Starters and Rangers with regards to first tee operations and control of play on the course, according to the budget; and
- b. Hole in One Cart Rental shall establish procedures for tracking daily pace of play, review, analyze and report status to the Commission monthly and recommend controls, innovations and procedures for improvement.

#### PROMOTION OF GOLF

- a. Hole in One Cart Rental shall promote, organize and direct golf tournaments for all Clubs and outside organizations in accordance with the guidelines and instructions set forth by the Golf Commission.
- b. Hole in One Cart Rental will promote a "user Friendly", professional and positive environment.

#### PRO SHOP

Hole in One Cart Rental will operate the golf shop in accordance with the same high professional standards currently employed in the operations.

Hole in One Cart Rental shall have the exclusive right and financial benefit to operate the golf pro shop.

- a. It will be Hole in One Cart Rental responsibility to equip, staff, supply merchandise and maintain said golf shop.
- b. Hole in Once Cart Rental shall have the exclusive right and financial benefit to maintain and operate a golf club repair at said facility.
- c. Hole in one Cart Rental shall have the exclusive right and financial benefit to provide for the rental of pull carts and golf clubs at a reasonable charge.
- d. Hole in One Cart Rental shall have the exclusive right and financial benefit to provide golf instruction for a fee. Use of the lessons area near the 6<sup>th</sup> hole requires the use of limited flight balls.
- e. Hole in One Cart Rental shall have the exclusive right to salvage and recover all lost golf balls from the ponds and waterways throughout the complex.

#### **GOLF PRIVILEGES**

Hole in One Golf Cart Rentals Head Professional and Assistant Professionals will have the right and privilege of using the golf course and a golf cart free of charge.

## PROJECT MANAGEMENT PLAN

Hole in One Cart Rental with Angela Aulenti as the sole officer and sole shareholder, has been the golf cart concessionaire at E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course for 20 years. In addition, Hole in one Ent. Corp, also owned by Angela Aulenti has been the concessionaire of the golf shop at Sterling Farms Golf Course since 1994 where she is the Head Golf Professional. Both E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course and Sterling Farms Golf Course under Ms. Aulenti's direction have demonstrated the ability to continually operate at the high level of excellence and integrity throughout the years, bringing value added to the City of Stamford.

As a golf professional, Ms. Aulenti is well respected by her peers and in her field where she has received several significant professional awards. She currently owns the titles of past president of the NE Section of the LPGA and is the national tournament coordinator for the LPGA. She maintains her credentials through further education and remaining involved in both the PGA and LPGA.

As it relates to the operation of the golf shop, the best example of her proficiency to both E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course golf shop and also at Sterling Farms Golf Course golf shop, is having both concessions near one another facilitating the ability to provide strong management to both locations while providing instant access to any merchandise, vendors, or staff should any unforeseen need arise.

In regard to golf course management and cart rental operation, Ms. Aulenti ensures that procedures will be in place in order to safeguard that all appropriate fees are processed, charged and collected and all golf cart rental agreements are in accordance with commission guidelines.

## Project Staff

Hole in One Cart Rental currently employs one Director of Golf, one Head Professional, one Assistant Professional and three to five shop/cart personnel. Ms. Aulenti's other concession Hole in One currently employs one Head Professional, three assistant professionals, one director of retail (which will oversee buying at E. Gaynor Brennan), one golf shop manager, 2 shop assistants and 10-15 junior golf counselors. This provides her with a readily available source of qualified back-up professionals for E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course.

Ms. Aulenti's resume and the resume of her head professional Vance Levin are attached for your review. Mr. Levin has been the head professional at E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course for the past 18 years.

As sole officer and sole shareholder of Hole in One Cart Rental, Ms. Aulenti contends that having a highly qualified golf professional as the Concessionaire helps create a professional atmosphere for the entire facility. For example, advice and cooperation will be provided to the Men's and Women's Clubs; the organization of tournaments and outings will be more efficient: and lessons will be conducted professionally. Overall, it is her strong belief that the organizational skills and professional reputation that she brings to E. Gaynor Brennan Municipal Golf Course, will help imbue a strong sense of pride among employees and clients alike.

## CORPORATE EXPERIENCES AND CAPABILITIES

The history of contract performance for Hole in One Cart Rental is best judged by the current contract performance with the city. Ms. Aulenti is not aware of any dissatisfaction with her performance of that contract to date.


The history of labor relations in not really applicable, as Hole in One Cart Rental, has had no interaction with any labor boards, issues, etc.



Following this cover are three (3) copies of a proposed Lease Amendment. The US Government (EPA) leases approximately 1,380 square feet on the 9th floor of Gov't Center. The original lease was executed in March 2009. The original Term of the Lease was 10 years. The City amended that Lease by way of a Supplemental Agreement (1st Amendment), dated May 13, 2010, which set the end-date at October 31, 2019. The US Government is now asking the City to execute a second Amendment which adds a 5-year renewal option. This second Amendment requires the approval of Planning Board, the Board of Finance and the Board of Representatives (in that order), per Ordinance Sec. 9-7.2, because the renewal option was not in the original lease.

The rent was \$64,266.60 per year for years 6-10, subject to CPI escalations. There is no change to the rent in the proposed second Amendment. David Nelson has confirmed that correct rents were received and CPI escalations were applied.






