I. Welcome

Karen Feder welcomed all and attendance was taken virtually.

II. Approval of Minutes

The February minutes were not approved due to lack of a quorum.

III. School Readiness Provider Reports

- SR provider reports were sent electronically to members and attendees for review. No questions were asked.
- February, 2021 School Readiness Provider reports are attached here as Addendum A, B,
 C, and D for BOE at Rippowam, CLC William Pitt, CLC Palmers Hill, CLC Westover,
 CLC Lathon Wider, CLC Franklin Commons and CLC Maple respectively.

School Readiness Liaison Report – Donna Arcuri

- February SR utilization Full Day 236 / 406 available, Part Day/ Distance Learning 36 / 66, Extended day 44 / 60 and School day 13 / 16.
- The OEC will continue to provide SR and CDC funded classrooms full funding for March, no matter utilization. Classrooms are expected to provide remote learning options for families in accordance with OEC guidelines in posted memos. Attendance and participation are being collected and retained for the SRC and OEC.
- Many daycare providers were vaccinated last Saturday and continue to be vaccinated. Lauren from the IC collaborated with CHC to reserve appointments for local daycare providers. Stamford's Health Department is also collecting information to share with Stamford Hospital. Stamford Hospital will then set up appointments with those providers.
- State funded second quarter monitoring was completed this month and the 3rd quarter monitoring sessions will begin at the end of this month through April. Directors have received their second quarter reports for review and signature. SRC members will receive copies of the reports once they have been signed. Third quarter monitoring will focus on teaching requirements and professional development requirements. Health files are monitored by a registered nurse will be confirmed by the School Readiness Liaison, Staff Professional Development plans will be reviewed, QSM compliance plans will be reviewed, NAEYC Accreditation Candidacy Reports will be reviewed with each Director to confirm that the OEC registry has been uploaded and up to date, staff and classrooms are in compliance with health and safety standards.
- Technology training and "Here to Help" link sent to preschool programs for family and program support.
- FY22 SR and QE grant applications have been emailed to Stamford's current providers It was decided last month to mirror FY21 Quality Enhancement funding for FY22. The OEC will consider FY 22 a continuation year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The due date is April 2.
- The governor announced class size will be increased to 20 on March 31 but guidance has not been sent from the OEC.

IV. Funded Classroom and Teacher Highlight Head Start /SR Extended Day Room 7– Enrique Pabon, CLC Maple

- Enrique created a video of Maple Avenue Room 7 and the Teaching team of Alicia McMillan and Aletha Hinton.
- Marsha Guthrie, Director and Enrique chose to highlight this classroom because of the team work displayed by the teaching staff and ability to switch gears immediately when needed. This team has flourished through any additional struggles they have had during the pandemic. Warmth is felt even virtually.
- Enrique shared a video of the classroom and teachers that included projects the children were working on that aligned to their unit on clothes. He showed bulletin boards of self-portraits and patterning artwork.

V. 4th Quarter Classroom Observation Overview – Kendra Brown, SPS

- Kendra reminded attendees that they are using a rubric for classroom observations with that the SPS early childhood team created with Margie Gillis of Literacy How.
- During FY20, the team focused on environment and literacy during classroom observation and saw great results.

- This year during FY21, the team will focus on read-aloud lessons. IC's have already put professional development in place for read-aloud instruction.
- A meeting with directors is upcoming on how to do read-aloud classroom observation virtually.

Classroom Learning Experiences

Weather permitting, outdoor learning experiences are still part of every day's plan. Classrooms
have scheduled nature walks where children observe the ever-changing environment and look for
winter animals.

• This month's Author Study focused on Ezra Jack Keats. Many of his books were read, and favorite stories were extended and developed throughout the curriculum. Following the reading of, *Louie* by Keats, the children created puppets to use in a puppet theater built with their teachers. They reenacted the story while creating new characters and alternative endings to make it a story of their own.

Home/School Connection Activity

- Through the use of Google Classroom the teachers continue to post classroom songs, games, finger plays, etc so parents can sing along and play at home with their child.
- During the month children wrote letters to their families and in turn the families were asked write letters to their child. The parents brought the letter to school and 'mailed' the letter in a mail box the class made. Teachers and children then shared the family letters throughout the day.
- Families were asked to take a winter walk with their child to observe winter animals and the changing environment. The children drew pictures of the animals they observed and brought their pictures to school to share with teachers and friends.

School Readiness Report Children's Learning Centers of Fairfield County February 2021

CLC William Pitt/ CLC Lockwood

• **Program Utilization:** Hours of Operation 8-5pm (M-F) 5 sessions offered: 8-3:30pm, 8:30-4pm, 9-4:30pm, 8-5pm, 9:30-5pm *Total number classrooms open SR:* 17 (William Pitt-13, Lockwood-4) William Pitt has 5 classrooms closed.

Total children enrolled SR: 210

Lockwood classrooms total: 50 children William Pitt classrooms total: 160 children

Staggered times for drop off and pick up has allowed for social distancing of families. Provided separate entrances and traffic patterns in the building. Children and teachers are required to wear masks. Teachers provide children mask breaks through-out the day.

• Staffing:

Staff patterns have been adjusted to meet the needs of each cohort with limited intermingling or sharing of staff. Each cluster is a cohort and averages 25 children. Staff shifts have remained the same in total hours worked, but times have been adjusted to accommodate the changes in drop off and pick up of children.

• Curriculum Focus:

- a. Teachers are preparing **Learning Experience Plans** based on the CTELDS and the individual needs of the children.
- b. Teachers focusing on **Preschool RULER** Reinforcing Emotional Intelligence in the classroom. Especially during the pandemic, this area has been addressed carefully. New language and routines for children include; mask, social distancing, change in classroom environment, individual art supplies, smaller class size, sanitizer use, etc.
- c. **Family Support**: Due to new protocols which prohibits families access to the classroom for safety precautions, teachers reach out to families to share information about their child's day through:
 - 1. Newsletters
 - 2. Weekly phone calls from teachers
 - 3. Emails
 - 4. Monthly phone calls from Educ Coordinators
 - 5. Monthly Family Engagement Plan
 - 6. Daily Google meets during building closure

Distance Learning: Allows teachers to reach children at home who are not in the classroom and gives teachers a chance to make a connection with families. 42 children are enrolled in Distance Learning. The 42 children are divided into 4 classes. The enrollment consists of many families that would have been our part day program. These families have decided not to send their children into the building for various reasons.

Distance learning is offered 5 days/week and includes:

- 2. Google meet/classroom (twice /week for 30 minutes)
- 3. Distance Learning Grid- emailed home (monthly)
- 4. Video Conferences
