II. School Readiness Provider September 2021 – School Readiness Program Directors

Enrique Pabon announced that CLC Maple Avenue has partnered with Intempo. Intempo is a community agency that provides cultural music and movement. CLC Maple Avenue has been and will be partnering with them with the children in their classrooms.

III. School Readiness Liaison Update – Donna Arcuri

• September School Readiness Utilization - (CLC) FD-277/425, /DL-27/28 ED 42 /60- CLC's payment was less \$29,041 including 25% supplement from the OEC (BOE) SD 13/16- \$9600 – Full reimbursement with the 25% supplement.

- SRC new Voting membership were welcomed.
- CLC Staff changes and promotions were announced
 - ✓ CLC has establishment a new role. Chief Education Officer (CEDO) for CLC. Anna Witkowski has been promoted to this role. All education, program and content functions will report to the CEDO.
 - ✓ Phyllis DiFrancia, Director of School Readiness Programs.
 - ✓ Beth Genovese, Education Manager of School Readiness Programs.
 - ✓ Linda Barge, promoted to Assistant Director of Child Development Programs.
- The OEC has resumed in person program monitoring. This will include Single State Audit monitoring, per site budget and expenditure report, classroom quality and fiscal monitoring
- The Governor extended OEC executive orders until Feb. 15, 2022.
- NAEYC Accreditation funds are available from the OEC.
- "Read to Grow" has provided books for all children enrolled in Stamford's state funded programs. Betty Davila's daughter Sophia has volunteered to sort and deliver. All sites should have books for each child to take home by the end of Oct.
- "Read to Grow" asks that parents email pics to be posted on Social Media.
- Emendya Diaz, Workforce Development Director of B1C has been providing information regarding classes, employment opportunities, volunteering and much more. Please continue to share this information with the families you serve.
- Supplemental Admin funds I have begun meeting with Literacy How and will have at least 8 trainings and classroom observations.
- Donna is exploring the possibility of Circle of Security to host a session in Stamford as well as Liaison CLASS Training.
- C4K parent fees will be paid by the OEC until the end of November 2021
- OEC Policy B-06
 - ✓ In maintaining compliance to OEC Policy B-06. SPS will be providing itinerant services to children in School Readiness classrooms.
 - ✓ Kendra Brown joined the discussion regarding B-06 and explained that SPS will be providing itinerant services at most CLC locations. The goal is to work with all programs but intentionally working slowly in expanding the program to insure success.
 - ✓ The classroom teachers at APPLES and CLC teachers are collaborating and meeting once to per month to insure children will receive a seamless day.
 - ✓ SPS plans to will include private preschool providers in this collaboration.
 - ✓ SRBI in preschool is continuing. Private providers please reach out if you require any guidance.
- Karen Feder reported that she and Terri Drew attended the OEC SRC Co-chair overview.

IV. Classroom Presentation – Family Connection/ Ruler Mood Meter – Luz Tsiralidis, CLC Palmers Hill Room 9

- Home and School Connection was adopted in Luz's classroom because "Come Visit with Me" has been suspended due to COVID.
- Parents are provided instructions in both English and Spanish.
- Parents are encouraged to share pictures of their home lesson.
- Parents are provided materials to extend a lesson from the classroom at home.
- September's lesson was on Social and Emotional development and the use of the "Mood Meter" helping children express their feelings.

- The Mood Meter uses color to describe emotions.
- Parents were provided with materials to create their own Mood Meter

Lockwood classrooms total: 36 children William Pitt classrooms total: 240 children

Provided separate entrances and traffic patterns in the building. Children and teachers are required to wear masks. Teachers provide children mask breaks through-out the day. Family members are also required to wear a mask for drop off and pick up. Families do not enter our buildings.

• Staffing:

Each cluster is a cohort. 2 classes at Lockwood are a cohort.

Open positions include: (1) Head Teacher, (2) Assistant Teachers, (3) Teacher Aide Full time, (4) Teacher Aide Part time. All classrooms satisfy QSM requirements.

• Curriculum Focus:

- a. Teachers are preparing **Learning Experience Plans** based on the CTELDS and the individual needs of the children.
- b. Teachers focusing on **Preschool RULER** Reinforcing Emotional Intelligence in the classroom. Especially during the pandemic, this area has been addressed carefully.
- c. **Monitoring of Classrooms**: Environments -Educ Coordinators
- d. **Family Support/Engagement**: Due to Covid protocols which prohibits families access to the classroom for safety precautions, teachers reach out to families to share information about their child's day through:
