Karen Feder welcomed all. Attendees introduced themselves. A quorum was present and the meeting was called to order at 12:05 pm and the School Readiness Council minutes for the June and July meeting Minutes were approved.

# II. School Readiness Provider Reports June, July and August 2021 – School Readiness Program Directors

Enrique Pabon announced that CLC Maple Avenue has partnered with Intempo. Intempo is a community agency that provides cultural music and movement. CLC Maple Avenue has been and will be partnering with them with the children in their classrooms.

#### III. School Readiness Liaison Update – Donna Arcuri

- OEC update
  - The OEC will continue to add a 25% supplement to state-funded programs monthly allocation until December 2021.
  - C4K parent fees will be paid by the OEC until the end of November 2021 for all programs.
  - State-funded program parent fees were paid by the OEC for July and August.
  - OEC verbally approved the slot change requested in June. Stamford now offers 425 full day, 28 part day, 60 extended day and 16 school day school readiness slots.
  - OEC's health and safety manual was updated in July. All were reminded to reprint or download.

- It was announced that Karen Cammarota has retired from the City of Stamford as Grants Officer. The new Grants Officer Anita Carpenter was introduced
- SRC Membership
  - Co-chair nominations and confirmations were approved via email on August 13, 2021. All approved Terri Drew and Karen Feder for another term.
  - Revised SRC membership guidelines have been legislated. Donna is in the process of recruiting a staff member from a workforce or job training organization, a representative from a local business, a representative from a healthcare provider, and parents of preschool age children.
  - The Superintendent designee is Dr. Michael Fernandes.
  - Mayor Designee is Cindy Grafstein
- On September 21, with the help of Nathalie Tocci, Community Nurse Consultant and Lauren Secko-Pagan, Director of the Education Station at the IC, the SRC will host a COVID Health Department Q & A webinar for providers and organizations that serve groups of children. Fiorella Velasquez a Stamford Health Department Contact Tracer will facilitate.
- FY21 Expenditure reports will be presented at the October SRC meeting
- FY22 1st Quarter monitoring will begin this month. It will be completed in person.
- Provider Fingerprinting Stamford will continue to host 211 fingerprinting events at the Adult Education building in September and October. There are added background checking steps required when registering for an appointment. Malena Loucks of SPEF has arranged these and is hoping to arrange monthly appointments for Stamford at least while fingerprinting is free.
- There is a possibility that Stamford PD will be offering digital fingerprinting.
- Referrals for Spanish speaking translators to join the SRC or to help with the Covid Webinars were requested.
- Voting members and directors decided to use liaison focused Administrative funds toward liaison training in literacy and trauma informed practice during monitoring. Meetings to schedule trainings will begin next week. These trainings will be shared with SRP directors, education managers, education consultants and if possible some teachers.

#### IV. SPS Early Childhood Updates – Kendra Brown

- Stamford Public Schools has submitted a grant to build a new early childhood center in Stamford.
- The center will support 680 children and house 36 classrooms.
- SPS plans to will include private preschool providers in this collaboration.

#### V. Kindergarten Registration Update – Dena Booker

- 2019-20 school year there were 1350 kindergarten registrations.
- 2020-21 school year there were 1129 kindergarten registrations.
- 2021-22 school year there were 1074 kindergarten registrations with 140 pending
- Families had home schooling option this year. Remote learning was not an option this year.

### VI. Cradle to Career Update – Tashi Shuler-Drakes

- Cradle to Career staff are in the process of hiring Parent and Community Ambassadors in collaboration with the OEC Parent Cabinet.
- Job announcements have been distributed throughout the community and Cradle to Career will also partner with the SRC to include Ambassadors with appropriately aged children to participate with the SRC.
- The Sparkler development screener is still being pushed out to the Stamford community. They will be tracking a cohort of kindergarten children.
- Parents will be added to leadership roles within C2C.

#### VII. Announcements

- Helma Gregorich announced that Family Centers is hiring parent educator home visitor. Applicants must be Spanish speaking to be considered
- Liz McKay announced that the Ferguson library will host a book giveaway until September 18<sup>th</sup> during open library hours. Flyer to follow.
