Work will commence at Scofield Magnet Middle School on or about Monday, September 16, 2019, for the removal of limited mold growth impacted drywall in the office adjacent classroom 240 and the storage room adjacent room 247. This work will be conducted from 3:30 PM to 12:00 AM, and is anticipated to be completed by Friday, September 20, 2019.

Starting on or about Monday, September 30, 2019, the cleaning of HVAC vents and removal of water stained and/or mold growth impacted ceiling tiles and pipe insulation throughout the building will begin. This work will be conducted Monday through Friday, 3:30 PM to 12:00 AM, and is expected to take approximately two weeks to complete.

Please be advised this work will be conducted in accordance with United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) guidelines for Mold Remediation in Schools and Commercial Buildings. Work will also be conducted in accordance with work procedures developed by Tighe & Bond, Inc., the City of Stamford's third-party Environmental Consultant/Industrial Hygienist.

The work is being conducted by A.A.I.S., Inc., an environmental remediation company. Tighe & Bond representatives will be onsite during the work to observe and document work conducted by A.A.I.S. Following removal, restoration work (replacement of materials) may not be conducted immediately to allow for the monitoring of water intrusion and leaks.

Please note this work is one part of a larger, comprehensive project at Scofield Magnet focusing on identifying water intrusion and mold growth issues within the building and permanently correcting any identified deficiencies. The Stamford Asset Management Group (former Stamford Mold Task Force) is working with an Architect/Engineer, Environmental Consultant, Construction Manager, General Contractor, and Remediation Contractor to identify and correct areas of concern at Scofield Magnet.
