OLD BUSINESS:

WASHINGTON BOULEVARD & PULASKI STREET WIDENING PROJECT - ACQUISITION BY NEGOTIATION OR EMINENT DOMAIN OF RIGHTS OF WAY: The Bureau of Transportation, Traffic & Parking proposes the roadway widening of Washington Boulevard, between Henry Street and Atlantic Street as well as Pulaski Street, between Washington Boulevard and the Pulaski Street Bridge (the "Project") to facilitate the completion of a long range plan to improve transportation and traffic operations around the Stamford Transportation Center, within the South End and connect to the City's \$5M+ investment in the Waterside neighborhood.

The Project would require property acquisitions, including the full-take acquisition of 21 Pulaski Street and three (3) partial take "sliver roadway widening" acquisitions (4 Pulaski Street, 256 Washington Boulevard and 274 Washington Boulevard) in addition to temporary Construction Easements to complete the Project.
