The Chairman, Mr. Hill, opened the Public Hearing on the Capital Budget at 7:35 PM.

Mr. Hill made introductory comments.

Board of Education:

A number of speakers expressed support of a third High School and resentment over the Planning Board's action not to support a third high school. Speakers also urged the Planning Board to accelerate the building of the additions to Westhill and Stamford High Schools due to the enrollment increases.

Several speakers spoke in favor of funding for the Alternate High School. One speaker supported the Planning Board's recommendation and stated that Stamford already has a third High School—the AIT—which hopefully will be expanded into a regional magnet.

Highways:

Several speakers spoke in favor of downtown streetscape funding for Spring Street.

Solid Waste:

Sandy Goldstein, DSSD, spoke in support of funding for downtown litter baskets.

Land Use Bureau:

A number of speakers spoke in favor of funding for the Mill River Corridor Development and for Open Space Acquisition.

There being no more speakers, the public hearing was closed at 9:10 PM.

Regular Meeting.

<u>Subdivision 3829—Dominick Cavaliere et ux</u> for a three lot subdivision on the east side of Rapids Road. Mrs. Dell and Mrs. Grosso expressed concern over the lot layout and the proximity to the CL&P Substation. Mr. Hill stated that it appeared that the lot does comply with the regulations. It was agreed to table the matter until the next meeting.
