

MINUTES OF PLANNING BOARD - REGULAR MEETING #3350  
TUESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2002

Present were DUANE HILL, Chairman; John Garnjost; Rose Marie Grosso; Marggie Laurie; Theresa Dell. Present for staff: Robin Stein, Land Use Bureau Chief.

Mr. Hill, the chairman, opened the meeting at 7:30 PM.

Mr. Garnjost moved to consider the following item, which was not on the original agenda: **Zoning Board Appl. 202-20 Sadie Green-Carter** requesting a special exception to allow a day care center at 126 Richmond Hill Ave. Mrs. Laurie seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

After discussion Mrs. Laurie moved to recommend approval. Mrs. Grosso seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Voting were the regular members present.

**Capital Plan and Budget 2003/04-2010**

The Board asked staff to further review the Administration requests regarding technology; phasing of street light energy improvements; functional value of the litter baskets; Scalzi and Rosa Hartman park improvements phasing; and Historical Society project.

The Board next discussed the **Board of Education requests**. Mr. Hill reported on his review of the School Facilities Master Plan prepared several years ago. He cited the proposal to expand the middle school at the former UCONN site. Mr. Stein reviewed a proposal of the Superintendent, which had appeared in an Op-Ed article in the Advocate last September. He said that it was based on a number of alternative programs (Wright Tech., AIT and Alternate HS), which, if successful in their development, would limit the impact of enrollment on the two existing high schools. It was also suggested that this concept, although never adopted by the Board of Education, was consistent with the Master Plan goals of providing diverse choices for Stamford's diverse population.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:15 PM.
