Part A - Description of Request

This project will bring up to date the pedestrian infrastructure at the signalized intersections with reported pedestrian related crashes (excluding locations already slated to be upgraded as part of other projects). Unlike specific intersections or corridors, this project will reach across all of Stamford. The project addresses ADA compliance and mobility issues for those with mobility disabilities, it builds upon proven safety measures like Yield to Pedestrian blank out signs, Leading Pedestrian Int, and concurrent crossings, upgrades the City owned signal infrastructure, and improves walkability by making crossing the street easier and safer.

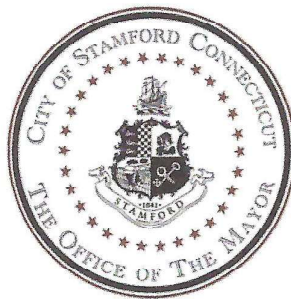

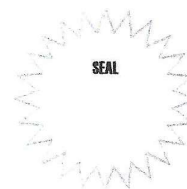
