Summary of proposal:

Shock Electrical Contractors, Inc. will provide street lighting maintenance and on call service in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, safety codes and ordinances with no less than (6) licensed electricians who are trained and experienced, certified and insured to perform installation, removal and replacement of high voltage electrical conductors as per CL&P NB-208 and OSHA Training.

Scope of Services:

1. Annual Routine Maintenance and Administration

Shock Electric will interface with the City of Stamford Citizens Center regarding request for street light maintenance from City residents and businesses. Shock Electric will provide 12 hours per week of administrative coordination of one (1) day per week of repairs, along with (8) annual night patrols for a minimum of 4 hours each on streets specified by the Energy/Utility Manager. Routine maintenance will be performed within five (5) business days of notification, weather permitting. Shock Electric will notify City of date and time repairs in addition to reporting of "no power" problems within three (3) working days via email. The contractor shall incorporate into routine repairs all streetlights repairs identified during its night inspections. City will purchase street light and materials and direct ship them to the contractor's warehouse based on inventory needs specified by Shock. Shock Electric will be expected to maintain an inventory or have readily available a supply of photo cells, lamps, ballasts and other equipment that is routinely used for these repairs in order to perform the contract in the time frame required.

Shock Electric's First response to a street light outage: replace the lamp and photocell with a new lamp and photocell to be provided by the City. The lamp shall be the same wattage as the current unless otherwise directed by the City. Shock Electric shall inspect the fixture and test it to determine that there is no power to the fixture. Shock Electric will "short out" the photocell to test the operation of the lamp. If there is no power to the fixture and the lamp does not illuminate, the fixture shall be replaced. Shock will thoroughly clean the lens and reflector. Any debris inside the fixture shall be removed. Shock Electric will check each fixture for proper grounding and for potential back wiring. Shock shall check each fixture for proper labeling of the streetlight fixture as the property of the City of Stamford and shall affix a label to be provided by the City on all fixtures not labeled. Shock Electric shall properly recycle any spent lamps and return any fixtures to the yard at 185 Magee Avenue where lamps, glass, and mixed metals will be properly recycled.

Second response to an outage after installing a new lamp: Shock will replace the fixture had, "short out" the photocell and test in for proper operation. Shock will remove any new lamps from the fixtures to return to inventory and properly recycle old lamps and/ or ballast, glass and mixed metals at 185 Magee Ave.

Repairs to LED fixtures: Shock will replace the photocell and "short out" the photocell to test operation of the fixture. If Shock determines that there is no power to the fixture and the fixture does not illuminate, one or both ballast will be replaced. Ballast removed will be returned to 185 Magee Ave/ for warranty replacement.

Work not included as part of routine maintenance and to be paid for by the City or others includes: installation of new street lights within new underground developments, upgrading obsolete fixtures and relocating brackets at the request of another utility. Street light power connections, disconnections, relocations and transfers will be performed by CL&P at the City expense.

Shock will provide a bucket truck with a minimum 40 FT. insulated boom and an insulated material handling bucket. Current OSHA certifications for the boom and bucket shall be provided to the City prior to the start of the contract. All equipment shall be kept clean and in good working order and repair. All vehicles used for the work of this contract shall have clearly visible on each side the name and phone number of Shock Electric. All Shock equipment will be in reliable working condition. Shock shall operate vehicles in such a manner so as to not impede traffic on City street.

Shock will be responsible for damage to private property arising from his operations. The city shall be held free of any and all liability arising therefrom.

2. Web-based Maintenance Management System (WMMS)

Shock Electric will utilize a WMMS to record, track and report on all maintenance performed on the City's streetlights. Weekly routes are to be communicated to the Engineering via email for comment and/or additions. An active historical database is to be kept for ease of searching records and for prioritizing second responses. A monthly report agreed upon with the Town shall be submitted with each monthly invoice.

3. Emergency Repair Service:

In the event that the City determines that it is necessary to perform any streetlight maintenance on an emergency basis, without waiting for normally scheduled maintenance, Shock will respond to a telephone request within 3 hours of such request.

4. Utility Coordination:

Shock Electric will coordinate streetlight repair and maintenance activities with Eversource. In order to minimize costs, Shock will notify and secure approval from the City for these activities followed by the direct scheduling of such assistance by Shock. In the event of a scheduling change for any reason, Shock will be responsible for cancellation of any utility assistance. Shock Electric will pay for any utility assistance if Shock Electric fails to cancel in a timely fashion.

5. Protection Crew Costs:

The City will be responsible for the cost of protection crews to the extent they are needed. The procedure for securing police detail assistance involves notifying and securing the approval of the City of Stamford, followed by the direct scheduling if such assistance by the Proposer. In event of a scheduling change for any reason, Shock Electric will be responsible for cancellation of any police detail. Shock Electric will pay for any details that it fails to cancel in a timely fashion.

6. Staffing and Qualifications:

Shock Electric shall have on staff no less than two (2) licensed electricians who are trained, experience, certified and insured to perform installation, removal, replacement, relocation, transfer and maintenance work on street lighting equipment in close proximity to high voltage electrical conductors, and per CL&P (Eversource) NB-208 and OSHA. Documentation of the license, training, certification and insurance for any and all employees that will be performing this work shall be provided to the City prior to the award of this contract. Shock Electric shall certify, in writing, that they will perform street lighting maintenance services in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, safety codes and ordinances. This specifically includes drug testing for all CDL licensed drivers and copies of driver's histories for any employees who operate the vehicle in performance of services related to this contract.

7. Other Assistance:

At the City's request, Shock Electric shall make itself available to attend City Representative and other meetings in order to report on issues concerning the street lighting system.



The contract to be awarded is subject to contract compliance requirements mandated by $\underbrace{\text{Sections } 4\text{a-}60}_{\text{dea-}60}$ and $\underbrace{\text{4a-}60}_{\text{dea-}81\text{i}(\text{d})}$ of the Connecticut General Statutes; and, when the awarding agency is the State, $\underbrace{\text{Sections } 46\text{a-}71(\text{d})}_{\text{dea-}81\text{i}(\text{d})}$ of the Connecticut General Statutes. There are Contract Compliance Regulations codified at $\underbrace{\text{Section}}_{\text{dea-}68\text{j-}21\text{ through } 43}$ of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, which establish a procedure for awarding all contracts covered by $\underbrace{\text{Sections } 4\text{a-}60}_{\text{dea-}71(\text{d})}$ and $\underbrace{\text{46a-}71(\text{d})}_{\text{dea-}71(\text{d})}$ of the Connecticut General Statutes.

An individual with a disability is also a minority business enterprise as provided by Section 4a-60g of the Connecticut General Statutes. The above definitions apply to the contract compliance requirements by virtue of Section 46a-68j-21(11) of the Contract Compliance Regulations.

The awarding agency will consider the following factors when reviewing the bidder's qualifications under the contract compliance requirements:

- (a) the bidder's success in implementing an affirmative action plan;

1) Definition of Small Contractor

Section 4a-60g CONN. GEN. STAT. defines a small contractor as a company that has been doing business under the same management and control and has maintained its principal place of business in Connecticut for a one year period immediately prior to its application for certification under this section, had gross revenues not exceeding fifteen million dollars in the most recently completed fiscal year, and at least fifty-one percent of the ownership of which is held by a person or persons who are active in the daily affairs of the company, and have the power to direct the management and policies of the company, except that a nonprofit corporation shall be construed to be a small contractor if such nonprofit corporation meets the requirements of subparagraphs (A) and (B) of subdivision 4a-60g CONN. MANAGEMENT: control the major functions of an organization through subordinates who are at the managerial or supervisory level. They make policy decisions and set objectives for the services. Job titles found in this category include company or departments. They are not usually directly involved in production or providing services. Examples include top executives, public relations managers, managers of operations specialties (such as financial, human resources, or purchasing managers), and construction

and engineering managers. BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL OPERATIONS: These occupations include managers and professionals who work with the financial aspects of the business. These occupations include accountants and auditors, purchasing agents, management analysts, labor relations specialists, and budget, credit, and financial analysts.

act or process of buying and selling products and/or services such as sales engineer, retail sales workers and sales representatives including wholesale.

LEGAL OCCUPATIONS: In-House Counsel who is charged with providing legal advice and services in regards to legal issues that may arise during the course of standard business practices. This category also includes assistive legal occupations such as paralegals, legal assistants.

COMPUTER SPECIALISTS: Professionals responsible for the computer operations within a company are grouped in this category. OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT: All clerical-type work is included in this category. These jobs involve the preparing, transcribing, and preserving o f written communications and records; collecting accounts; gathering and distributing information; operating office machines and electronic data processing equipment; and distributing mail. Job titles listed in this category include telephone operators, bill and account collectors, customer service representatives, dispatchers, secretaries and administrative assistants. computer operators and clerks (such as payroll, shipping, stock, mail and file).

Managers plan, organize, direct, and BUILDING AND GROUNDS CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE: This category includes occupations involving landscaping, housekeeping, and janitorial supervisors of landscaping or housekeeping, janitors, maids, grounds maintenance workers, and pest control workers.

CONSTRUCTION AND EXTRACTION: category includes construction trades and related occupations. Job titles found in this category include boilermakers, masons (all types), carpenters, construction laborers, electricians, plumbers (and related trades), roofers, sheet metal workers, elevator installers, hazardous materials removal workers, paperhangers, and painters. Paving, surfacing, and tamping equipment operators; drywall and ceiling tile installers; and carpet, MARKETING AND SALES: Occupations related to the floor and tile installers and finishers are also included in this category. First line supervisors, foremen, and helpers in these trades are also grouped in this category.

INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR: Occupations involving the installation, maintenance, and repair of equipment are included in this group. PRODUCTION WORKERS: The job titles included in this category are chemical production machine setters, operators and tenders; crushing/grinding workers; cutting workers; inspectors, testers sorters, samplers, weighers; precious stone/metal workers; painting workers; cementing/gluing machine operators and etchers/engravers; molders, shapers and casters except for metal and plastic; and production workers.

- Q: Has the City converted any of its 9,600 lights to LED? The RFP mentions only "non-LED" in the scope of work.
- A: Yes, approximately 4,280 of the lights have been converted to LED.
