In addition, 2 high school interns will work for three weeks.• Grants: Lot of grants are expiring, working with the Grants department to submit new applications for funding to support the following programs:• Blood Pressure• Dept of Health Emergency Preparedness• STD and TB been expanded for another year.• Infectious Diseases are on watch. The State is watching closely for any uptick.• Immunization and Workforce development funding. Anticipating funding however the State has been slow in providing information for applying.	
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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Legislation passed for:<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Free school meals for all ages.• Husky enrollment extended age limit from age 13 to 15.• Tax incentives for grocery stores to open food desert.• Medicaid coverage for community health care workers.• Accreditation: 27% of required prep is completed, ahead of schedule.• Health Promotion - Pride Month: Britany is working closely with Stamford Cares, Norwalk Health Dept and other agencies to put together messaging that serves the LBGT community.• Social Services: Busy working with HUSKY enrollment and assisting, seniors with rent rebates, beach stickers and other senior eligible services.• Climate Change Plan: implemented by the mayor and working with Operations and Zoning.• Infectious Disease: COVID is at the lowest point even though we still on occasions get cases reported. | |
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<p>Director of Public Safety, Health, and Welfare Mr. Louis DeRubeis</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Our epidemiology update from the State is focusing on Monkey Pox and encouraging vaccination. TB is steady, working closely with Stamford Hospital.• Physicals: Moira working with our partners to register children for physicals and immunizations.• School Nursing: Two new nursing positions approved in the budget.• Lab: working on beach water testing and tick testing.• Environmental Inspection: Working on temporary events. Food inspectors working to vet and inspect outside food vendors.• Noise complaint: Restaurant/ food establishments and construction site.• Updates Air quality issues: Air monitoring in place since May 2022. Readings are higher than normal.• Ten monitors in various sites in the city that measure particulate matter in the air.• Monitoring Program can advise people with respiratory issues to stay indoors.	
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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mr. DeRubeis and Jody presented to the Public Safety Commission last month regarding receiving a grant to acquire three additional meters, which will be incorporated with the 10 purple monitors. The meters will measure ozone and carbon dioxide in addition to particulate matter.• Concerns have been raised regarding additional resources to be allocated for maintenance.• Mr. DeRubeis stated that the Health Department has been messaging the public through social media and the City website for those with pre-existing conditions that make them susceptible to becoming ill with exposure.• Mayor's office has put out an emergency alert exploring cooling centers and shelters for vulnerable residents. In addition, Jody stated being in communication with schools regarding end of year guidance for school children.• Emergency Shelter Planning: (exercise last month). Health Department setting up and operating shelters in case of a surge of migrants coming to the city. Stamford is seeing a steady flows of immigrants through normal channels and working collaboratively with Region One and State in anticipation.• Stamford Police Dept: held a community Behavioral Health Fair. There were 40 different vendors and organizations to educate the public | |
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	on available resources in support for behavioral and physical issues. Informing the community “No One is Alone.”
