Dear Mrs. Powers:

The Board of Ethics considered the question posed in your letter of May 7, concerning a possible conflict of interest should Kaufman Insurance Service, Inc., who you represent as an agent, bid on an insurance contract for the Golf Authority.

The Board of Ethics decided that under the procedure of competitive bidding, there would be no conflict involved. Kaufman Insurance Service, Inc. should feel free to make a bid.

However, if any item comes before the Board of Representatives concerning the Golf Authority, you should abstain from discussion and voting on the issue if 1) Kaufman Insurance Service obtains the insurance contract, or 2) if the bid process is unresolved.

In the event of abstention, it is recommended that you make a full disclosure to the Board of Representatives, giving the reasons for abstaining.
