Section 175-1-5: Damaging Park Property.

- (a) No person shall intentionally or recklessly damage or deface any grass area, tree, shrub, plant, building or other property in any park or recreational facility. The use of glue, nails, tacks, screws, staples or other fasteners that may scratch or otherwise damage surfaces of any building or shelter, or the use of chalk on any surface, whether or not in connection with an otherwise permitted use of any park or recreational facility, shall constitute a violation of this section.
- (b) In any proceeding for a violation of this section involving a motor vehicle, the operator of such vehicle, or, where the operator cannot be identified, the registered owner of such vehicle, shall be deemed prima facie to be the violator.
- (c) In any proceeding for a violation of this section involving an event being held pursuant to a permit, the individual engaging in the act and the event permittee may each be deemed to be the violator.
- (d) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be guilty of a Level 4 violation of these Regulations.

Section 175-1-9a [NEW]: Use or Possession of Balloons or Confetti.

- (a) No person, whether acting individually or as a member of an event being held pursuant to a permit, shall possess, use as decoration, discard, or release into the atmosphere balloons, confetti or glitter within the limits of a park or recreational facility.
- (b) In any proceeding for a violation of this section involving an event being held pursuant to a permit, the individual engaging in the act and the event permittee may each be deemed to be the violator.
- (c) The provisions of this section shall not be deemed to apply to natural substances such as dried flowers, leaves, or birdseed used in lieu of confetti.
- (d) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be guilty of a Level 3 violation of these Regulations.

FOR COMMISSION'S REFERENCE:

Level 1 fine currently equates to \$75 Level 2 fine is \$100 Level 3 fine is \$150 Level 4 fine is \$250

Most current fines are Level 2 or Level 3. Board of Representatives will make final determination but Commission can recommend which level it believes is appropriate.
