



Pursuant to emergency powers as set forth in Connecticut General Statute Section 28-8a and Section C3-10-10 of the Charter of the City of Stamford, I hereby issue the following Executive Order.

**MAYOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER  
DELAYING BY SIXTY DAYS THE  
EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE NO. 1262**

Whereas, Section C3-10-10 of the Charter of the City of Stamford and Chapter 517 of the Connecticut General Statutes confer upon the Mayor emergency powers to deal with public health emergencies, such as the global pandemic of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), to ensure that preparations of the City will be adequate to deal with the emergency, and to preserve the lives and property of the residents of Stamford; and.

Whereas, on March 11, 2020, Mayor David Martin declared a Public Health and Local Civil Preparedness Emergency in the City of Stamford; and

Whereas, Section 28-8a of the Connecticut General Statutes empowers the mayor to take such action as he deems necessary to mitigate the emergency; and

Whereas, it has come to the attention of the City of Stamford administration that supply chain issues as a result of COVID-19 have made it impossible for local businesses and establishments to secure single-use, drinking straws and stirring implements that are made from non-plastic materials, such as paper, metal, pasta, sugar cane, wood or bamboo.

1. Effective immediately, the effective date of Ordinance # 1262 will be extended for sixty days until August 23, 2020; and
2. This order will expire upon the cessation of the Declaration of Public Health and Local Civil Preparedness Emergency.
