Monday, June 24, 2024

Attendance and quorum check: Members in attendance: Eva Weller, Carmen Hughes, Sandra Barrett, Deborah Goldberg, Yelena Klompus, Naomi Osei-Mensah, Sonal Patel, Malinda Polite, Ajmal Qureshi, and Ana Gallegos. Shobhna Bhatnagar gave reasons for her absence.

Meeting called to order: Eva Weller, Chair, called the meeting to order at 6:18 pm.

Welcome: Eva Weller welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Approve Minutes: May 28, 2024, Eva asked members to review the minutes from the May 28 meeting. Malinda Polite made the motion to approve the minutes as presented. Deborah Goldberg seconded. Minutes were approved unanimously. Carmen suggested that minutes only reflect major topics and take-aways.

Budget Report: Chair Eva Weller said that the proposed and approved budget for Stamford Day 2024 is \$4,534. The budget report is not final yet. The treasurer sent a report with actual expenses of \$3,365 to date. When all expenses are paid and reported, Shobhna will submit the final year-end report.

Projects/Events Report:

* Stamford Day 2024: Eva reported that Stamford Day 2024 was the largest and most successful. She thanked everyone who contributed to make it such a success. Feedback from several sources was that the event was well organized, started and ended on time. Fifteen dignitaries made meaningful presentations. Many volunteers helped to set up and clean up. The passport activity was very popular. It was suggested that more passports be available next year. Children liked doing the Quilt activity. It was suggested to have a table or an area for the children to sit and draw. Clipboards could then be returned and reused for next year. Having a completed guilt on display was also suggested. The registration table gave one bag to each family. One water bottle was in the bag and additional bottles of water were needed for families. There were 224 bags left over. Ana thanked Council members who led different stations: Sonal - Volunteers, Malinda Polite - Quilt, Deborah Goldberg - Passport (100), Yelena Klompus - dance groups, Pilar Pelaez - food trucks and food (Eden Huang), George Johnson - Tell Your Story, Malinda Polite - Quilt (31), Naomi Osei-Mensah -Registration. Carmen Hughes ordered supplies, program and organization posters and coordinated printing quilt and passports and increased the size to make them more appealing. There were 53 registered volunteers, and around 42 amazing volunteers attended and were most helpful during the event. We have a list of 80 organizations and 55 community organizations registered and 47 attended. Marlene and Mauricio filled the Stamford Day Banner with community organizations flyers and pictures. One large group of Chaplains helped with parking, street crossing and security, and the other group with set-up & clean up and where needed during the event. Council member, Shelly Nichani, donated snacks and water for 500 bags. We had sixteen groups performing; INTEMPO and a new Greek group participated for the first time. There were three food trucks.

It was suggested to have a separate meeting to focus on Stamford Day 2024 on Monday, June 8. Eva Weller said that it was a fun family event and thanked everyone for their time and help and asked members to highlight successes and bring suggestions to make the event even better.

They will pay for the percussion and MMC would pay for the dance instruction with Alisa's House of Salsa at the same cost as last year. Yelena Klompus made the motion to have the two Salsa Nights in partnership with Mill River Park Collaborative. Ana Gallegos seconded. Motion was approved unanimously. Eva said that we'll need to get ready to promote it in social media and more. It was suggested that Alissa be asked to spend more time on dance instruction. Yelena motioned for MMC to co-sponsor the Ferguson Library's September 15h event for Hispanic Heritage Month.

Also suggested for consideration was an event at Mill River Park modeled after Stamford Day. Carmen will check dates with Mill River Park.
