COVID Alert CT: What it does

- Find out if you've been near someone who tested positive
- Anonymously report if you test positive
- Your information will be protected, and your location will never be tracked

The Process

You spend more than 15 minutes within 6 feet of someone within a 24 hours period. You both have the app, and your phones exchange anonymous tokens via Bluetooth.

That person tests positive for COVID-19.

After that person receives their test result, they're contacted by a contact tracer, and the contact tracer gives them a verification code to enter into the app.

Once they enter the code, you will get a notification that says you may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, and you should contact a Connecticut contact tracer.


The contact tracer will give you information about testing, self isolation and quarantine, and state resources available to you.

If you test positive, you will receive a verification code from a contact tracer, and your contacts will also receive notifications.


The app works most effectively when more people have it on their phones.







State of the City: COVID19 Case Trends








Neighborhood is "PurpleRed" with Coronavirus






State of the City: COVID19 WPCA Wastewater COVID Concentration





State of the City: COVID19 Hospitalization Rate







Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Individuals


 President Trump signed the \$1.4 trillion omnibus spending bill on Monday

Direct relief to individuals:

- \$600 for adults making up to \$75,000 and \$600 for each dependent child.
- \$300/week additional unemployment benefit through March 14, 2021.
- Emergency federal residential rental assistance program (\$25 billion) to be distributed by state and local governments.
- Extends existing CDC eviction moratorium through January 31, 2021.
- \$13 billion for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

Other relief

- \$68 billion to purchase and distribute COVID-19 vaccines and help states conduct testing.
- Includes a provision ending surprise medical billing. Patients would be required to receive a "true and honest cost estimate" three days before any scheduled procedure — billing disputes would be subject to arbitration.





Federal COVID Stimulus Relief: Businesses

Small business relief

- PPP loans: The new \$284 billion round funding provides a great opportunity for companies that did not receive a forgivable PPP loan earlier this year.
 - It also allows businesses with 300 or few employees that experienced more than 25% revenue loss in the first, second or third quarter in 2020 to secure a second forgivable PPP loan.
- Full deductibility for business expenses paid with PPP proceeds.
- \$15 billion would be reserved for live venues, independent movie theaters and cultural institutions, which have been struggling due to pandemic-forced closures.
- \$10 billion for childcare centers to help providers safely reopen.
- S. 4479, a set of temporary commercial bankruptcy provisions to help commercial landlord and tenants, particularly small businesses. Another provision gives small tenants the benefit of more time to defer rent in their bankruptcy case as well as repay the deferred rent over time.



State of the City: COVID19 Enforcement Update







Inspections and enforcement continue for the following:

- Restaurants and bars, business commercial (auto parts, mattress stores, shoe repair, etc.), dry cleaners, retail department stores, food and grocery stores, senior housing, fitness and gyms, pharmacies, laundromats, liquor stores, banks, etc.
- Complaints received and investigated for lack of social distancing, lack of proper mask usage, possible overcrowding
- Approximately 400 COVID-19 focused inspections.

Enforcement encompasses three levels:

- Warnings (40) Improper mask usage and improper social distancing
- Summons (4) \$500 for overcrowding, \$100 for not wearing a mask
- Closure (4) Overcrowding, lack of mask usage, improper social distancing

Gatherings

- Private, social and recreational gathering sizes Private Residences
 - Indoor Cap of 10 people; Outdoor Cap of 10 people
- Private, social and recreational gathering sizes Commercial Venue
 - Indoor Cap of 25 people; Outdoor Cap of 50 people


Fines:

- \$100 Failing to wear a face Covering.
- \$250 for attending an event that exceeds capacity limits
- \$500 for organizing an event over limits,
- \$10,000 businesses in violation of the state's COVID-19 sector rules and capacity

- Restaurants
 - Up to 50% capacity indoors with 6 foot spacing and/or non-porous barriers; max of 8 people/table






