





 2.3% of Population



Winter Storm Response

Forecast

- Roughly 14 to 16 inches of snow
- Potential for more snowfall Tuesday evening
- Wednesday morning, mostly cloudy with a high of 35F

Snow removal

- Approximately 100 City Operations staff dedicated to snow response
- Roughly 40 snowplows cleared roads, both primary and secondary
- Roads are drivable

Other developments

- 17 motor vehicle accidents reported, 16 minor, 1 major (1 individual transported to Stamford Hospital in stable condition)
- 0 power outages at this time, previously reported 45 power outages or .07% of Eversource customers in Stamford
- 71 cars towed from Snow Emergency Routes. Residents are reminded to move their cars to City garages before snowstorms. Parking is free during Snow Emergencies.
- Stay safe! Stay indoors! Don't overexert yourself when shoveling snow!








NEW State Guideline for Businesses


- Effective Tuesday, February 2nd, 2021, the following business sectors will be subject to a 11:00 p.m. closing time 7 days per week.
 - Restaurants (last service for in-person dining at 10:30 p.m., although takeout and delivery may continue)
 - **24-hour diners** may reopen for indoor dining for breakfast at 5:00 a.m.
 - Entertainment and recreation venues (e.g. movie theaters, bowling alleys, performing arts theaters)
 - Indoor and outdoor events at commercial venues
- New Capacity
 - Religious Gatherings Indoor Up to 50% capacity (no cap) with masks and social distancing required





State of the City: COVID19 Hospitalization Rate





WPCA Wastewater COVID Concentration







Joan H. asks:

"My mother — age 86 — lives in Westchester County, New York. Several of her neighbors have booked appointments for vaccines at Stamford Health through their zocdocs.com system. Is this legal? *If they do not live or work in Connecticut can they be vaccinated in Connecticut?*"

Answer: The most reliable way to get a vaccine — without risk of getting your appointment canceled — is to register in your state of residence.

The State Department of Public Health asks only those who live or work in Connecticut receive a vaccination in Connecticut. Although some residents may have been successful receiving a vaccine outside of their state of residence, this is not recommended.



Roberta B. asks:

"Is it possible we can make an appointment over the phone rather than doing so online? I do not own a smartphone and do not use social media."

Answer: Yes, residents can call either:

- the State of Connecticut's vaccination assist line at 877.918.2224 or
- Stamford Health's vaccination assistance line at 203.276.7300.

The State of Connecticut has invested significant resources into its assist line. It has recently reported wait times as short as 3 to 5 minutes. Stamford Health continues to train more staff to take phone calls as well.

Residents are asked to remain patient as both numbers are receiving a large volume of calls.



Marilyn F. asks:

"I am a healthy 67-year-old. May I complete the registration form now for the vaccine, so that it is ready when my tier of Group 1b is allowed to get the vaccine? It would seem that would alleviate what will otherwise be a crush of people trying to fill out the forms at that time."

Answer: We recommend only residents eligible for the vaccine signup for a vaccination appointment at this time.

Both Stamford Health and the State Department of Public Health have increased their resources to manage more signups. Some residents may have heard of long wait times to schedule an appointment, but the online signup portals listed below at have been reliable. Online registration is the best method for signing up for a vaccination appointment.

Dave S. asks:

"I am a 68-year-old Stamford resident, when can I book a vaccination appointment?"

Answer: The State of Connecticut's Department of Public Health is following a phased vaccination rollout based on recommendations from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention). The City follows the State's DPH phased vaccination rollout.

The State has not announced a specific date for when residents 65 and older can signup to get vaccinated. For up-to-date information on eligibility, access, and assistance with vaccination, visit the State's website here:
