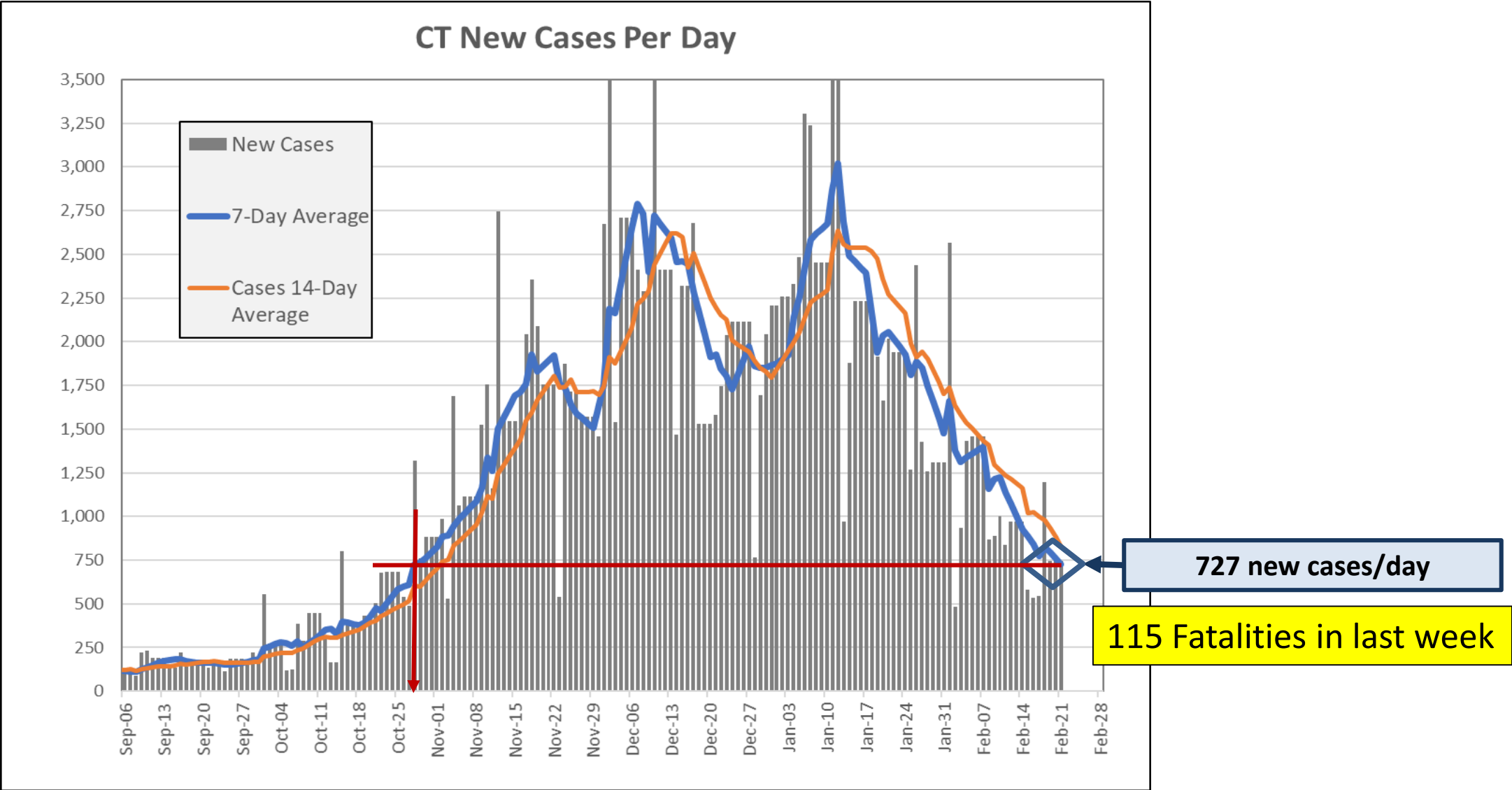

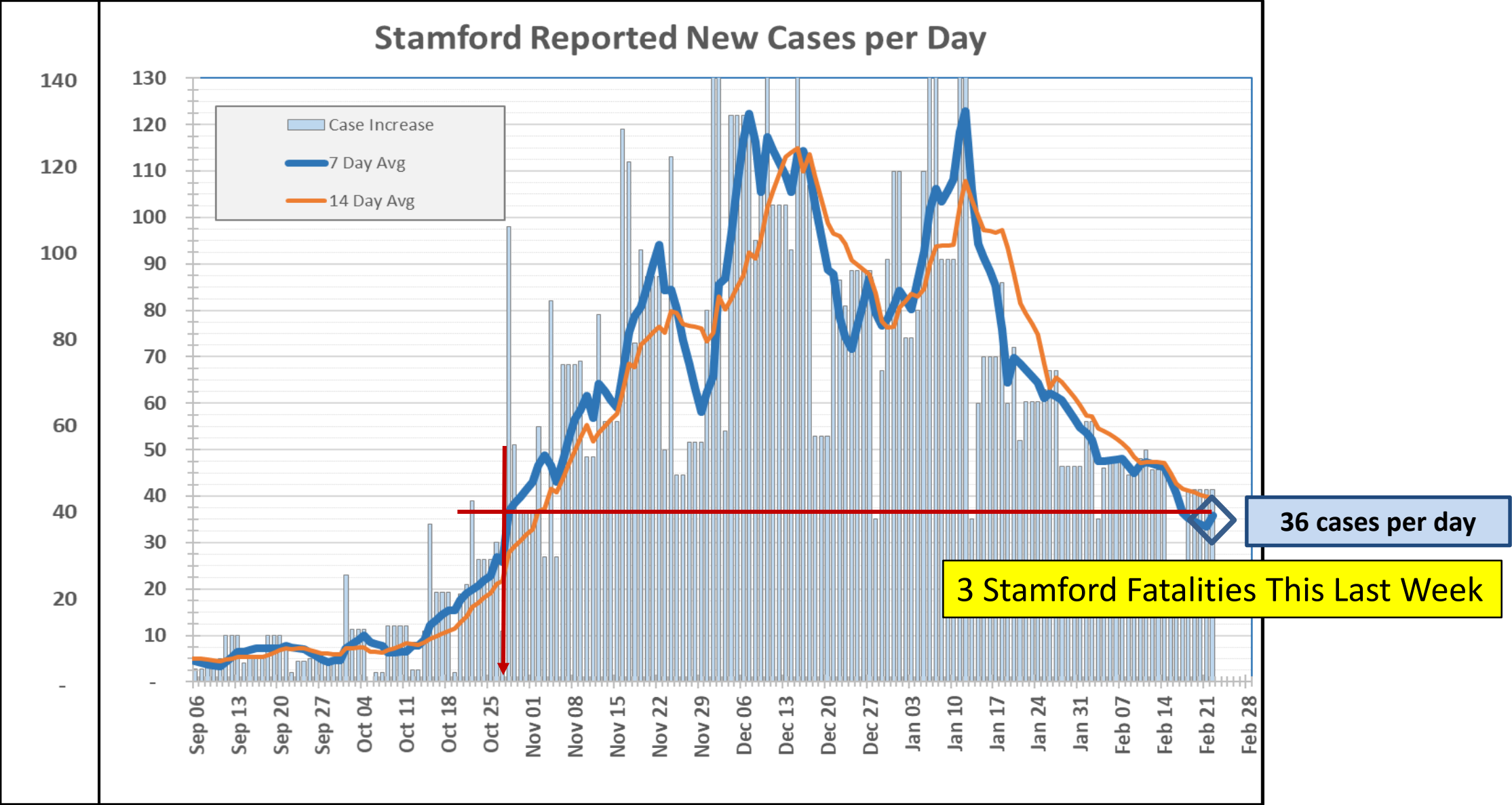

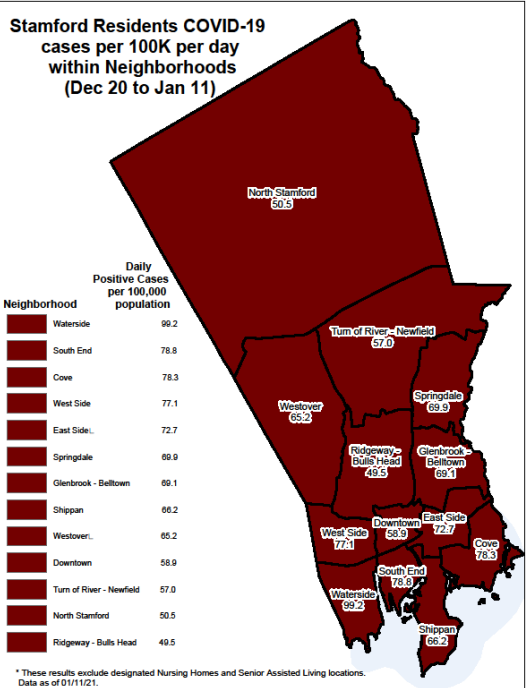

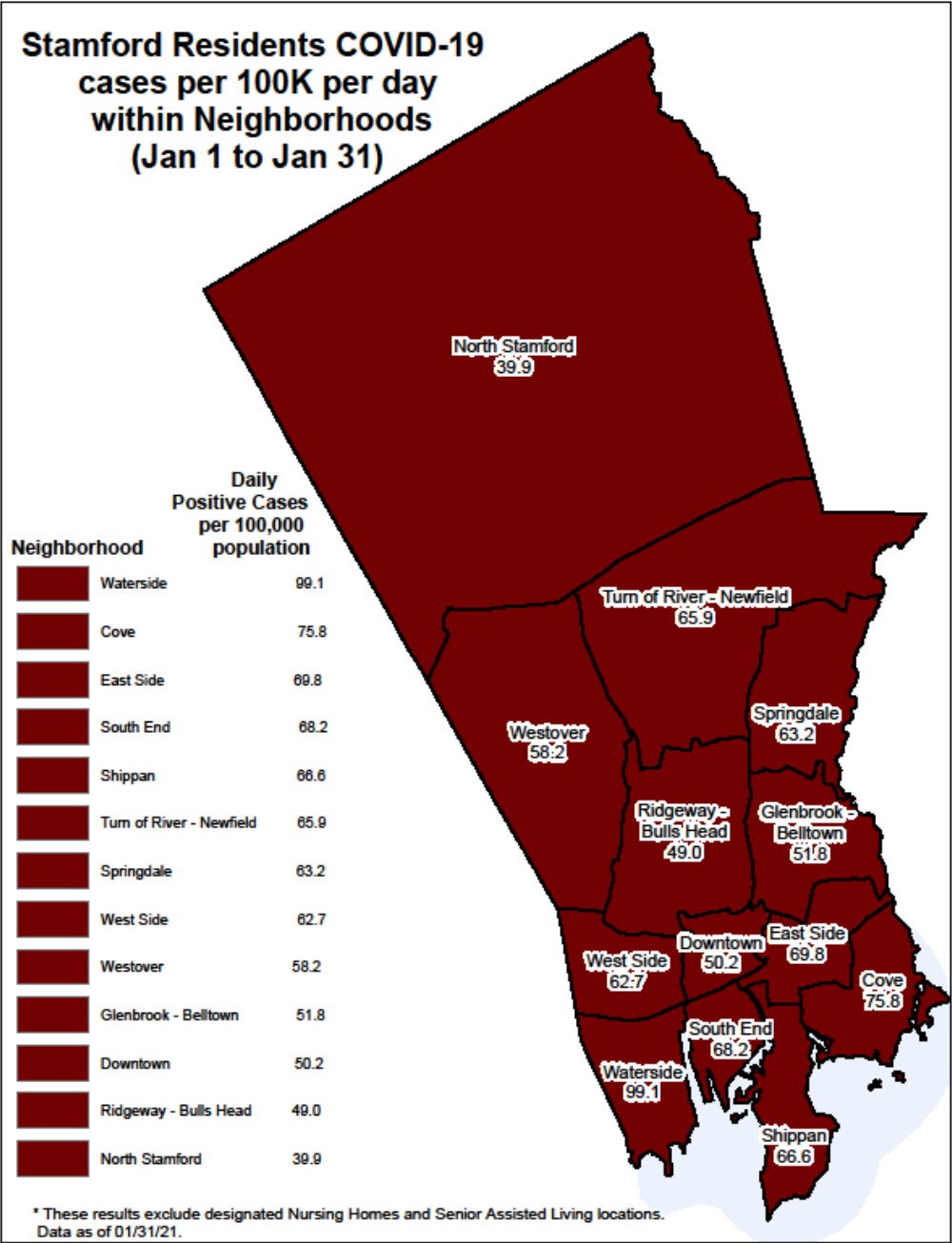
Neighborhood Case Levels



Every Stamford Neighborhood is “Purple-Red” with Coronavirus



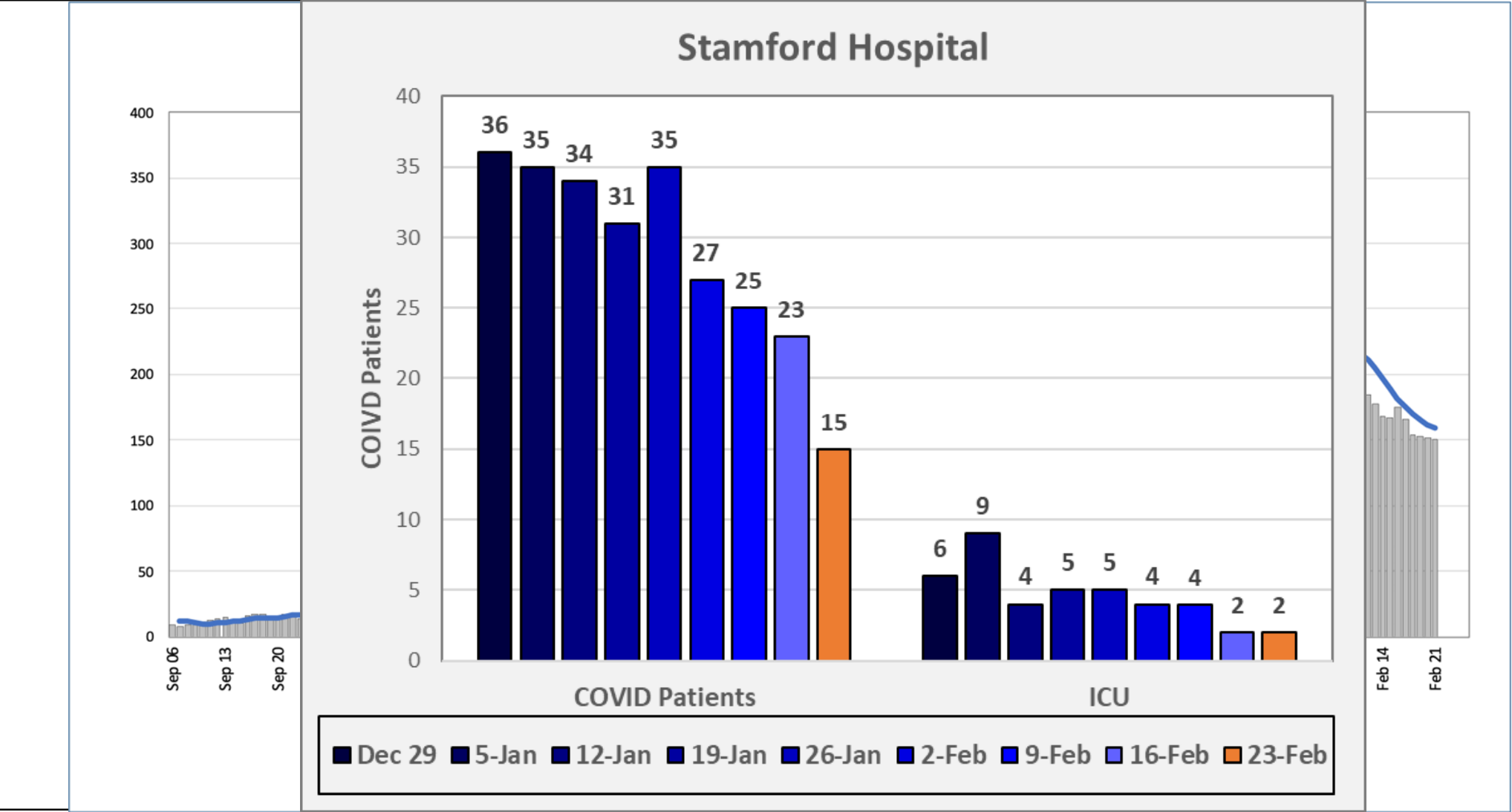
Last Neighborhood Map



Excludes Nursing Homes/Senior Care Facilities

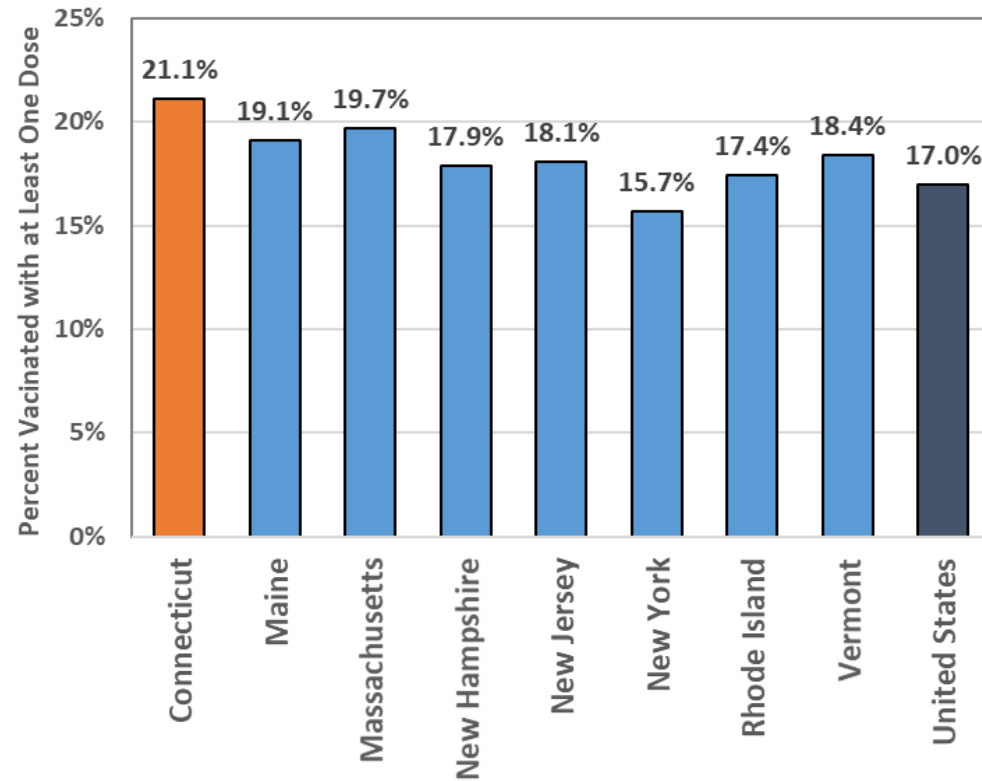

Hospitalization Rate

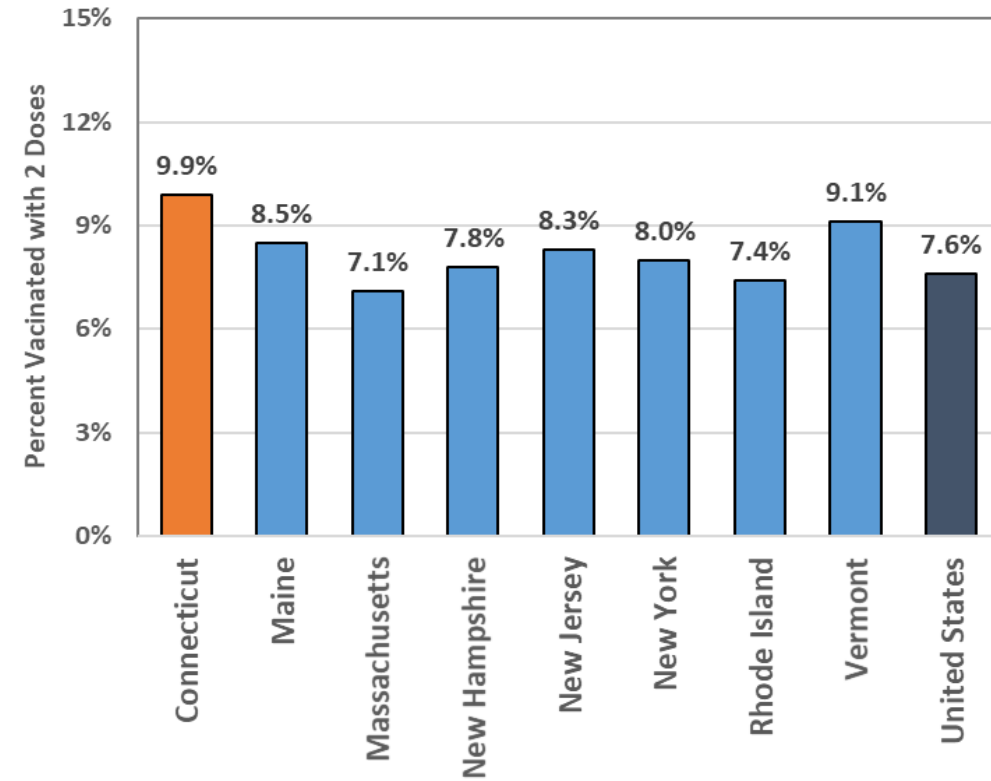


State of Connecticut: Covid 19 Vaccination Rate

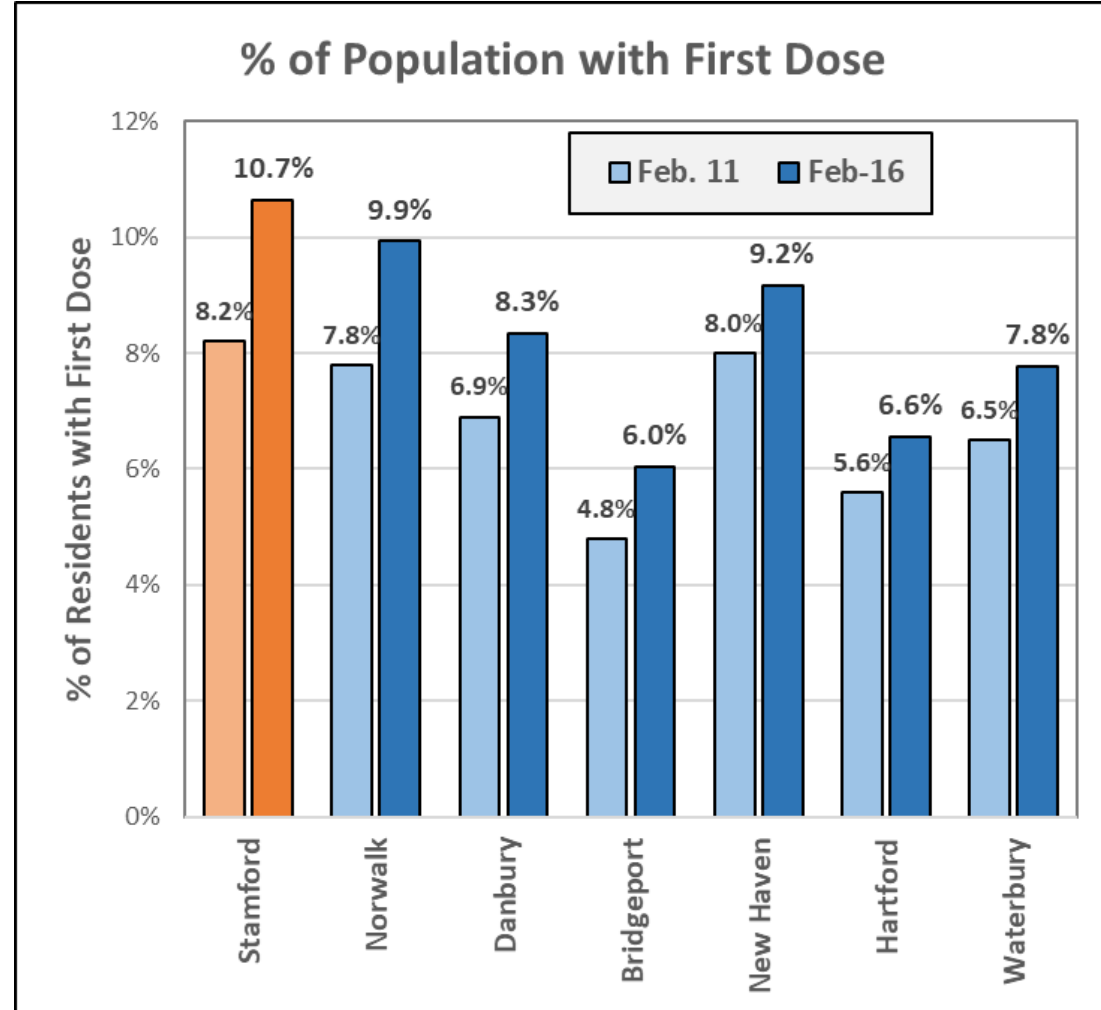
Percent >18 Vaccinated At Least One Dose

Newly Announced State Vaccine Plan



New announcement:

- Age – based approach
 - Can be vaccinated through providers such as Stamford Health
- Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade teachers and school staff
 - Will be contacted by employers about when in March and where they may be vaccinated

Former plan:

- Broad frontline and essential workers
- People with certain serious health conditions

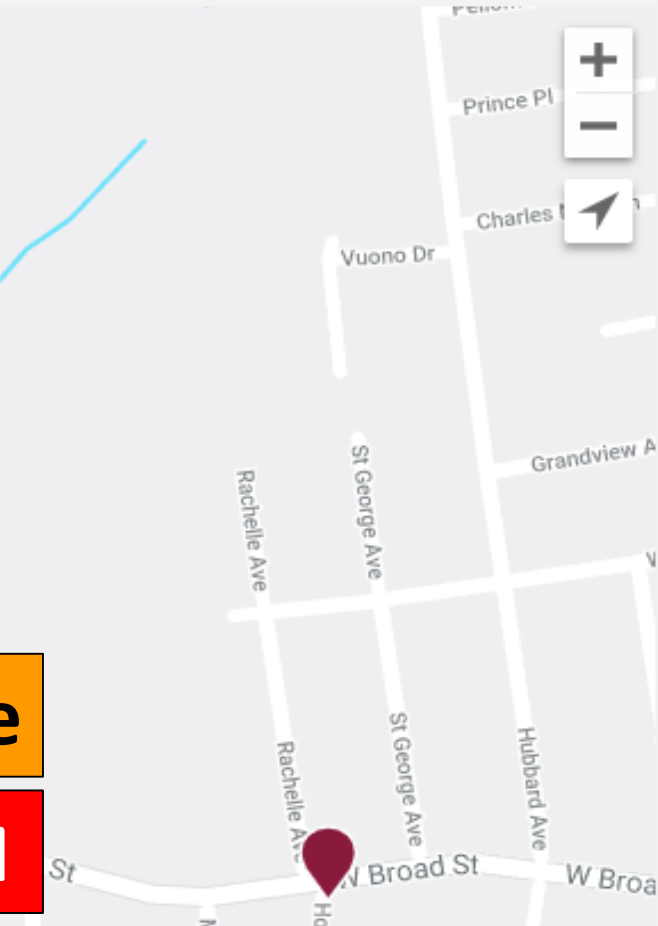

Department of Health Update



- **Bedbound COVID-19 Vaccination Program For Stamford Residents**

A person is considered to be bedbound if they meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Resident never leaves home (resident spends 60% of time in bed and the rest of the time must be seated in chair and all services are brought into the home for the resident,)

OR

- Resident leaves home but leaving the home requires lifting/carrying by another individual or stretcher transport, e.g., persons who lives in a high-rise building that only has stairs (no elevators) and the person is unable to climb stairs.

- ***NB: Persons are not considered bedbound if they use of a cane, walker or have the ability to transfer to a wheelchair or car with supervision/light contact.***

State Guideline for Businesses

Effective Monday, March 1, 2021, the following business sectors will be subject to:

- Interstate competition will begin for youth sports in medium and low risk categories
 - 25% capacity capped at 200 people

Effective Friday, March 19, 2021, the following business sectors will be subject to:

- **Private, Social and Recreational Gathering Sizes – Commercial Venue**
 - **Indoor** – Up to 50% capacity, capped at 100 people
 - **Outdoor** – Cap of 200 people



Small Business Funding

- White House announced targeted changes to the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)
- Businesses and nonprofits with fewer than 20 employees will have a two-week exclusive window to apply for PPP loans starting Wednesday, February 24.
- Other changes include:
 - Self-employed and sole proprietors can now use gross income (versus net income) to calculate the PPP loan amount, increasing potential loan size.
 - Business owners behind on their federal student loan payments are now eligible for PPP loan forgiveness.
 - Clarification that non-citizen small business owners who are lawful U.S. residents can use an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) to apply for the PPP.
 - Small business owners with prior non-fraud felony convictions are no longer excluded from applying for PPP loans.

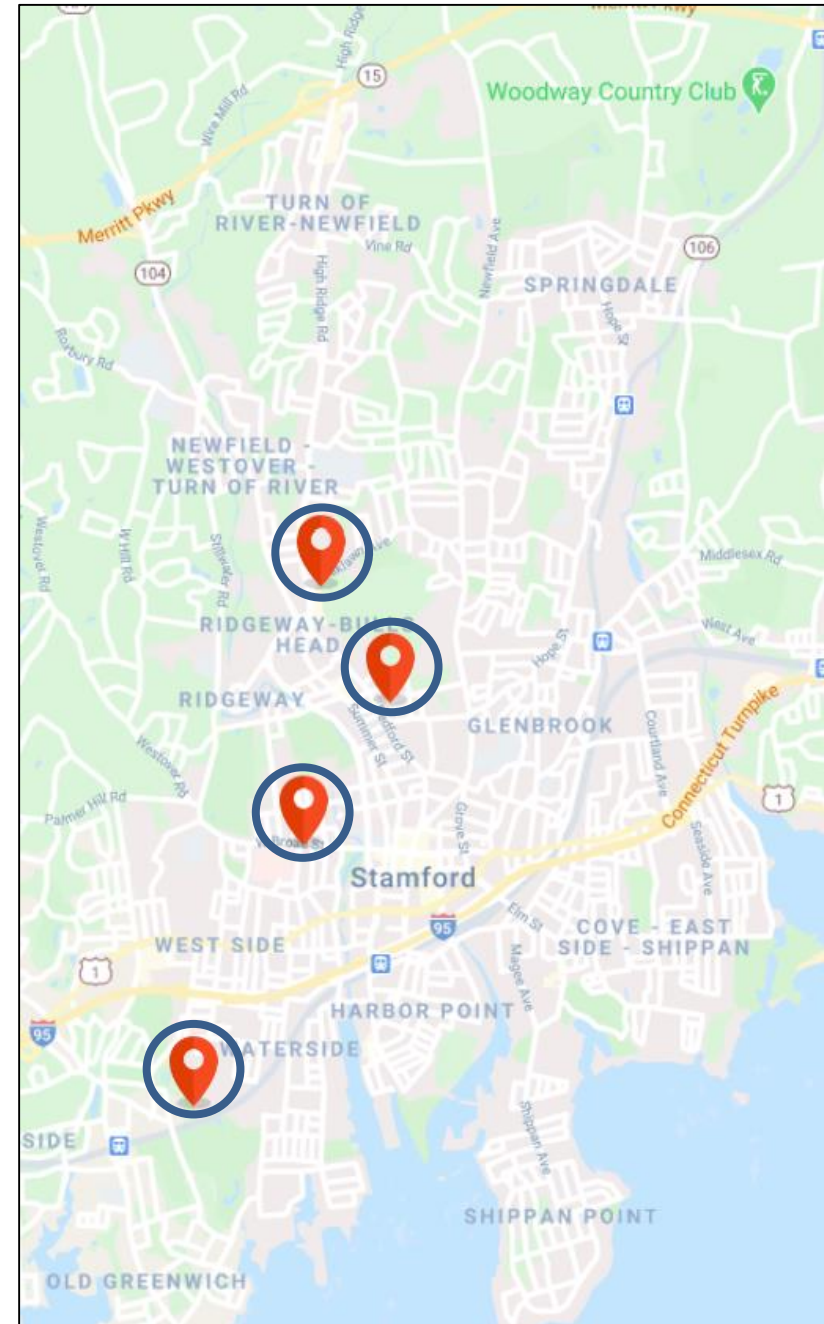

Several people have been asking:

“When will teachers be vaccinated, and when will Stamford schools open full time for students”

Answer:

Governor Lamont announced yesterday that all school staff, including public schools, private schools, and day care, would be eligible for vaccinations starting in March.

Stamford Health Department, Stamford Public Schools, and Stamford Health are already working to develop a schedule to vaccinate teaching staff as soon as possible.

Stamford Public Schools are evaluating if, and when, they can reopen schools for all students in the classroom. This may depend on how quickly we can get school staff vaccinated and the rate of cases in the community.
