






Case Trends




State of the City: COVID19 Hospitalization Rate




State of Connecticut: Covid 19 Vaccination Rate





Lynn asks:

“Is it possible to schedule an appointment based on the brand of vaccine offered (Pfizer vs. Moderna vs. Johnson & Johnson)?”

Answer:

You cannot choose your vaccine.

All approved vaccines have proven extremely effective at preventing serious disease, hospital admissions, and death. Pfizer and Moderna require two vaccinations 3 to 4 weeks apart . . . J&J is “one and done”. None have serious side effects. And all are free.

Health experts recommend getting the first vaccine that you can.

Tony asks:

“I am 45 years old and attempted to book an appointment once I became eligible but there are no appointments for over a week. Why are there no appointments?”

Answer:

Vaccination appointments are based on anticipated vaccine supply.

The federal government has announced they’ve ordered enough supply to vaccinate every person in the country and that supply will be available to CT in the coming weeks. Vaccines are disseminated through the State Department of Health — who we continue to receive vaccines from every week. We appreciate the public’s patience as we continue this rollout.
