
State of the City: COVID19 Case Trends





State of the City: COVID19 Hospitalization Rate







State of Connecticut: Covid 19 Vaccination Rate






Vaccinations: Schools

CHC is administering vaccines to all high school students ages 16 and older.

- This Saturday and Sunday, April 17 & 18 (2nd dose May 8 and 9)
- 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM
- Drive Thru Clinic at Bull's Head (old Lord & Taylor site)
- Registration through link sent by Stamford Public Schools through School Messenger
- If student is under the age of 18, registration form requires consent of parent or guardian



Stamford Public Schools Update

- March 9: Elementary Hybrid students begin inperson learning.
- March 17: Middle School Hybrid students begin inperson learning
- April 19: High School Hybrid students begin five days-a-week in-person learning

Janssen Vaccination Update

- As of Tuesday, April 13, we have paused administration of the Johnson & Johnson (J&J)
 vaccine per guidance from the CDC and FDA
- Reports of blood clots and low platelet counts occurring within 2 weeks of administration of the vaccine.
- These events have been exceedingly rare six individuals in the 6,800,000 vaccine doses that have been administered so far i.e., "one in a million"
- Similar findings with AstraZenica vaccine
- Suspected to be immune-mediated
- Symptoms such as severe headache, abdominal pain, leg pain or shortness of breath occurring within 2 weeks of vaccination. Cerebral and splanchnic events.





Janssen Vaccination Update

- Roughly 100,000 Connecticut residents have received the J&J vaccine with no reported serious adverse events.
- Stamford Health / City of Stamford have administered fewer than 1,700 doses of J&J vaccine, with no serious adverse events reported to our knowledge
- Individuals who have an upcoming appointment scheduled to receive the J&J vaccine will be
 offered an alternate product (either Pfizer or Moderna) and/or rescheduled.
- Our current supply of J&J vaccine is limited, and the pause will not impact any operations at our mass vaccine clinics (Wheeler, Elmcroft)
- We still feel that the J&J vaccine is a good vaccine. It is effective in preventing severe disease, hospitalization and death from COVID-19 and it is logistically easier to administer, making it ideal for use in mobile clinics, door to door outreach, and for people who may have difficulty returning for a second dose of vaccine.
- Additional guidance will be forthcoming from the CDC and FDA after further deliberation.


