






State of the City: COVID19










State of the City: COVID19 Hospitalization Rate





State of Connecticut: Covid 19 Vaccination Rate









State of the State: COVID19 Vaccination Impact






State of the Country - Vaccination Coverage

Stamford Health COVID-19 Update

COVID-19 Restrictions for Businesses

All Businesses/Organizations (March 19th)


- Capacity limits are now up to 100%, subject to social distancing requirements (unless otherwise noted). However, it is the right of the operator/owner if they choose to operate below 100% capacity.
- 6 ft. spacing and social distancing continues to be required where possible (unless otherwise noted).
- Masks continue to be required in all public settings where social distancing is not possible.
- All establishments must follow <u>CDC Cleaning and Disinfecting guidelines</u>.



COVID-19 Restrictions for Businesses

Effective May 1, 2021:

- Bars that do not serve food can open for service on an outdoor-only basis. These establishments will still be prohibited from serving only alcohol indoors.
- The 8-person per table limit will be lifted for outdoors only. This limit will remain in effect for indoor service.
- The curfew for restaurants, entertainment venues, recreation venues, and theaters will be moved back an hour to midnight.







COVID-19 Restrictions for Businesses

Effective May 19, 2021:

- Contingent upon sufficiently low rates of infections and increasing vaccination rates, all remaining business restrictions will be lifted.
- The Department of Public Health will issue recommendations for indoor and other large outdoor events, such as concerts, as well as clarify where masking will continue after May 19.







SBA Grants – Restaurant Revitalization

- SBA may provide funding of up to \$5,000,000 per location (not to exceed \$10,000,000 total) for Applicants who meet eligibility requirements.
- The minimum funding amount will be \$1,000.
- For example, if Applicant X has a reduction in revenue of \$2,000 but has a PPP loan for \$1,500, the Applicant's application will not be approved for processing and funding because the net funding calculation is less than \$1,000.
- The Restaurant Revitalization grants program website is up.


SBA Grants - Restaurant Revitalization

Eligible entities are businesses that are not permanently closed and include businesses where the public or patrons assemble for the primary purpose of being served food or drink including:

- Restaurants
- Food stands, food trucks, food carts
- Caterers
- Bars, saloons, lounges, taverns
- Other similar places of business in which the public or patrons assemble for the primary purpose of being served food or drink
- *Bakeries
- *Brewpubs, tasting rooms, taprooms
- *Breweries and/or microbreweries
