Call for New Applications

Milton Puryear, representing Mill River Collaborative, presents new application for cameras in Mill River Park. He discussed his rationale for the request with the Committee, including

- He wants the public to know the cameras are there, to encourage best behavior by guests of the park
- The playground has visitors after dark, who sometimes leave debris

- Some robberies have occurred at the area of the Main Street bridge
- He would like to monitor the restrooms adjacent to the playground, for safety of children and visitors
- Concern for equipment storage
- Skateboarders wear down the stone
- Ice skating equipment that is yet to be built and installed
- Carousel pavilion in north west corner by Dunkin Donuts, yet to be built

Mr. Puryear walks the Committee through the locations they are considering.

Mike Toma speaks about the Agreement between the City and Mill River Park Collaborative, specifying "patrolling" by Mill River Park Collaborative. The Park remains a City park, so this Committee's authorization is required for MRPC to move forward with installing cameras.

The Committee discusses questions of costs, number of cameras, signage.

<u>Motion</u> – to accept and hold the Mill River Park application, moved by Paul Waldron, seconded by Don Rozier. Motion passes unanimously.
